Continued from Page 1 A survey of cattle producers said the Texas cattle industry loses \$67 million annually because of fire ant damage.

Frisbee said fire ants are attracted to electrical transformers.

Bobby Singletary, an engineering supervisor at Bryan utilities, said fire ants build up mounds in electrical transformers and can cause a short if the live parts are exposed.


We've opened up the lid of a "You don't always have transformer and its packed completely full of ants," Singletary said. "The utility companies have to keep repairing the damage fire

ants cause," Frisbee said. Singletary said electrical shortouts from fire ant damage rarely occur though.

"They're just a pain, basically," he said.






