Dr. Bob Mayfield, director of the Baptist Student Center, said Baptists do not formally observe Ash Wednesday.

"Southern Baptists typically do not get into such liturgical practices," Mayfield said. "We are from the Separatists in England (who wanted to) separate from Roman Catholicism and the Church of England."

Deborah Grant, pastor of Peace Lutheran Church in the Station and a representative of Lutherans, said Lutherans have unique customs for Ash Wednesday.

"We follow practices that go back to the customs of old," said, referring to Roman Catholicism and the early Protestant church.

Peace Lutheran Church will have an Ash Wednesday service at 7 p.m., during which there will be an imposition of ashes similar to Episcopal and Catholic ceremonies.

Frank Yates, director of the byterian United Campus Ministry, said Ash Wednesday has two purposes for Presbyterians, which are biblical. The first is repentance to God with ashes.

The second purpose is to remind worshippers of man's mortality, with minister quoting "dust to dust, to ashes," from the book of Genesis.

Presbyterians may place ashes on their foreheads, Yates said.

"[Presbyterians are] liturgical not so much as Episcopalians or Catholics," Yates said. "The ashes is optional. [Ash Wednesday] is a particularly solemn, moving time in the church's year."

It is a good time to reflect, think about things you want to change and about the brevity of life.

A&M Presbyterian Church will hold a dinner at 6 p.m. with Communion service immediately following.

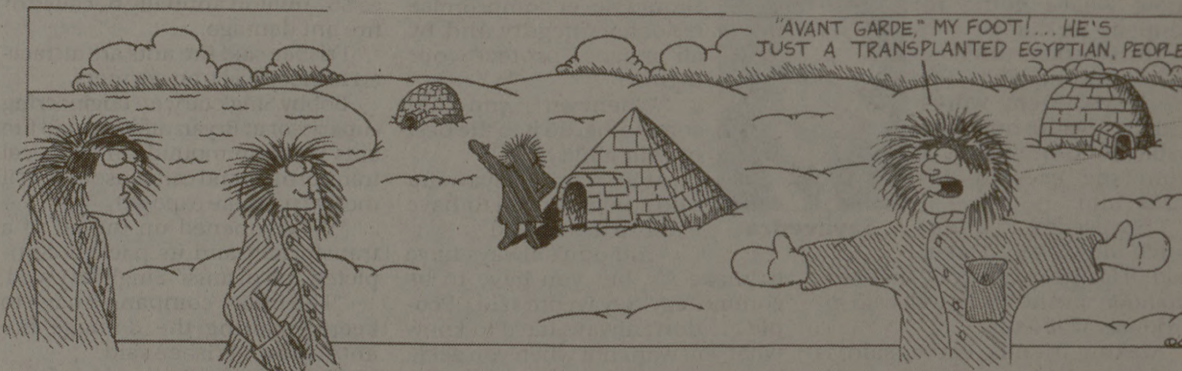
Representatives of the Methodist Wesley Foundation were unavailable for comment. Representatives of the denominational Grace Bible Church declined comment.
