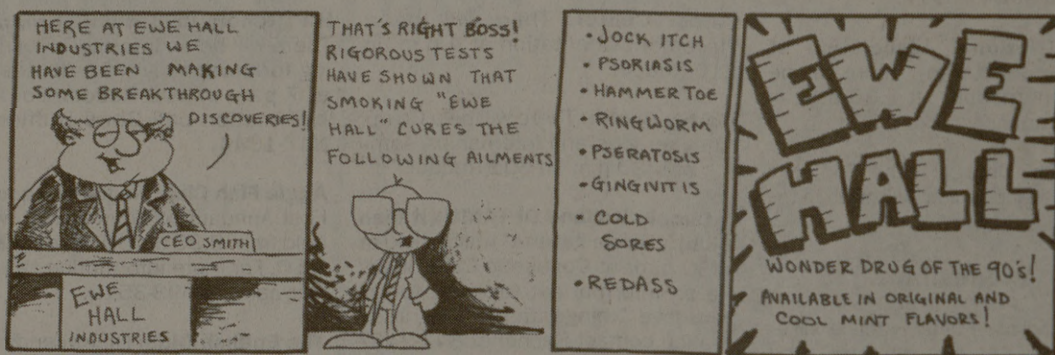

Council may change blood requirement

EL PASO (AP) — The Tigua governing council, worried the tribe could eventually die out, resurrect an effort to reduce the percentage of native blood needed to be Tigua.

The measure would be aimed at securing the rights of members like 10-year-old Jacob Ortiz, who was born to a Tigua Indian mother and a non-Tigua father. He is not considered one by the tribal government.

Jacob does not meet a federal blood makeup requirement for membership and cannot receive federal benefits for Tigua. Although his mother does, she is not a Tigua.

The process of reducing the "blood quantum," or requirement for membership set at one-eighth blood, would require an act of Congress.

Many in the tribe would like to see the blood quantum lowered to one-eighth, but those who are one-eighth Tigua but were not registered within a year of birth — and to those whose names left off the base rolls to establish descendancy.

A similar effort was made in 1994. Longtime tribal lawyer Diamond said, the bill never made it past the committee stage.

"It's probably still sitting on someone's desk up there," Diamond said he plans to submit the same legislation to the Tribal Council for approval. The council agrees, he said he will ask U.S. Rep. Silvestre Reyes, Texas, to take the proposal to Washington.

The Tiguas are one of about 554 federally recognized tribes that do not have their own blood quantum. The other 554 federally recognized tribes set their own requirements and can change them through legislation within the tribal government, Lathel Duffield, chief of tribal enrollment bureau, said.

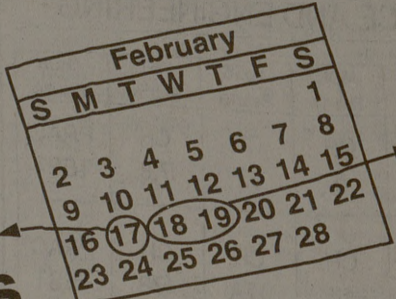
