

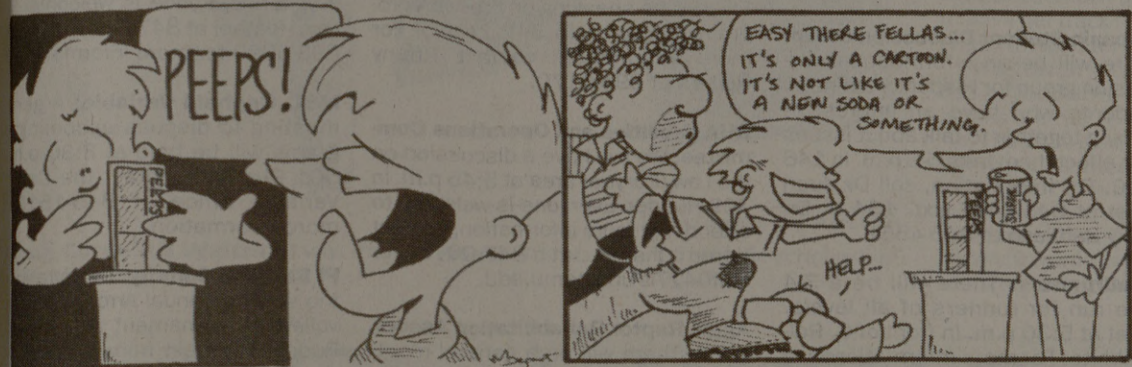

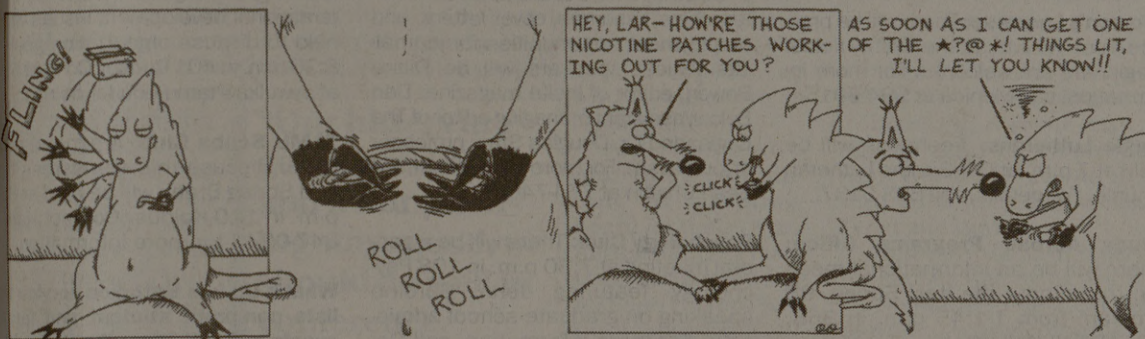

"There are some things (dishes) you've never heard of and they're really delicious," Garza said. "[It is] a big 'go eat as much as you can' thing."

She said 28 countries will be represented at the buffet. Each country brings 300 servings of three dishes for a total of 900 servings of food from each country.

Thursday, delegates from countries represented at A&M will attend a Consul Banquet. A&M administrators and international student leaders also

will attend the banquet.

International Week concludes Friday with an international talent show and fashion parade in Rudder Auditorium at 7 p.m. The theme for this year's dress parade is "The Story of a Celebration's Costume." Participants will tell the story of the origin and purpose of their costumes.

After the show, there will be a closing ceremony with international music and food. Awards for outstanding country presentations and performances will be given at an awards party.

Kumar said International Week is not just for international students. The events are open to all students and the

Bryan-College Station community. He said it will be an experience everyone will remember.

"It's one way of bringing them a step closer to the international students here in a way which is mutually beneficial," Kumar said. "It's fun, but it's enlightening to learn more about different people."

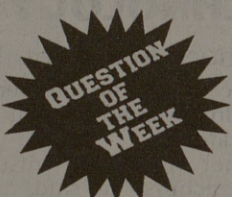

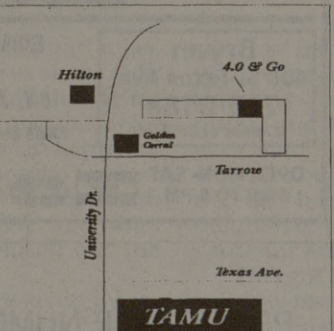
