Scarcella said the conference has given him the chance to talk to other educators.

"I met and spoke with many other teachers," he said, "and we have exchanged information about the different things we are doing in our classrooms. The conference also included a

presentation by Marilyn Fowler, a science specialist with the Texas Statewide Systematic Initiative. She discussed the design technology and engineering for America's Children Program.

Terrance Kaster, a technology teacher in the Tyler School District, said the program is great for preparing elementary-age children for the world in which they will work.

"This program brings technology down to the grade-school level," he

said. "We have seen third-graders using x-acto knives and building bridges. It is all so neat.'

Kristine Abrahamson, a junior elementary education major, said she works with kindergarten children who use technology programs. She said it is amazing to see what children can master in kindergarten, let alone what they will be able to do as third-graders. Greer said the conference targets
