Sasse said, in the press release, that
the study of current housing conditions was needed before a plan could
be created for the future. "Now we know what we're up
against, and we can devise a way to deal with it," he said. The study rated 14 percent of $\mathrm{A} \& M$ housingingood concition, 70 percent
in fair condition and 16 percent in
poor condition. Karen Fisher, director of facilities
and operations for the Residence Hall Association and a junior zoology major, said the study ranked problems to determine which were most urgent.
