On this date:

In 1687, French explorer Robert Cavelier, sieur de La Salle the first European to navigate the length of the Mississippi River — was murdered by mutineers in present-day Texas.

In 1859, the opera "Faust" by Charles Gounod premiered in Paris

In 1917, the U.S. Supreme Court upheld the eight-hour workday for railroads.

In 1918, Congress approved Daylight Saving Time. In 1920, the U.S. Senate rejected for the second time the Treaty of Versailles by a vote of 49-35, falling short of the twothirds majority needed for approval.


In 1931, Nevada legalized gambling.

In 1945, about 800 people were killed as kamikaze planes attacked the U.S. carrier Franklin off Japan; the ship, however, was saved
