"Obviously it shows that A&M is becoming one of the top institutions in the nation," he said.

The article highlighted A&M's first woman student body president, Brooke Leslie, who served in 1994, and its philosophy department, aspects not normally mentioned about the University.

Burka interviewed Dr. Robin Smith, head of the philosophy department. Smith speculated that Burka chose to include the philosophy department in the article because the idea of an Aggie philosopher "sounded odd."

"Certainly think it (the article) is wonderful publicity for the University as a

whole, and it's nice to be the department mentioned like this," Smith said.

He said the article will have a positive effect on A&M's reputation.

"The article seemed to me to be highly sympathetic," he said. "From the standpoint of the University as a whole, it was really a first-rate article [and] publicity we should be very glad to have."

Carl Baggett, student body president and a senior accounting major, agreed the article is good publicity for the University.

"[The article will] maybe let other people know what we've known for a long time," he said.

He said the picture the article paints of A&M represents a balance of academics, tradition and student activities.

"Academically we're now equal to other institutions," Baggett said. "[But] we've also kept that Aggie spirit — that balance — that makes us what we are."

"The GSC Research Week is dedicated to developing strong communication for intellectual development and research," Moore said.

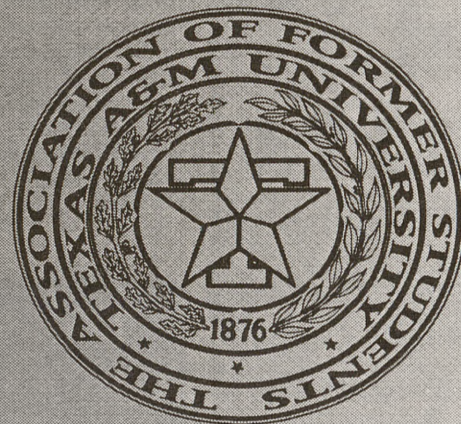
