Aggies drop third game to OU, 12-11

NORMAN, Okla. (AP)—After defeating the University of Oklahoma Sooners, 8-7 and 5-4 this week, the Texas A&M Baseball team dropped the third game in 10 in Oklahoma City Sunday.

A&M (18-13, 5-7 Big 12) trailed 11-10 lead in the top of the 11th inning before the Sooners rallied from the bottom of the frame.

Jose Montenegro reached first on an infield error to open the inning and advanced to second on a sacrifice bunt. Pinch runner Chad Cochell walked the third on a groundout and after leg was Bookout, who homered earlier, intentionally walked Betts following the game-winning single to right field.

Geoff Geary (1-1), Oklahoma Sooners pitcher, picked up the victory after Sooners improved to 16-8 overall, 3 in the Big 12.

Track and Field teams home seven gold medals

The Texas A&M Track and Field Teams brought back seven gold medals from the Dr Pepper Invitational in this weekend.

Seniors Anjanette Kirkland and Rosa Jolivet highlighted the performances with a 1-2 finish in the 100-meter hurdles. Kirkland placed first in a time of 13.21, which is an automatic qualifying time for the NCAA Championships. Jolivet placed second in a time of 13.68.

"Anjanette and Rosa are two of the top hurdlers in the nation," A&M Coach Ted Nelson said. "They are putting themselves in a position to both contend for the national title in the 100 hurdles."

A&M also took first in both men's and women's 400-meter races. Also posting victories were Ryan Nuti in the discus, Mike Lowrance in shot put, Todd Fox in the 3000-meter steeplechase and Toya Jones in the 100-meter dash.

Women's tennis perfect in Big 12

The Texas A&M Women's Tennis Team continued its domination of the Big 12 with an 8-1 victory over Iowa State Sunday afternoon.

The Lady Aggies, ranked 23rd in the nation, improved to 3-0 in conference and 10-2 overall. They are yet to lose a Big 12 singles match this season.

"We did what we had to do to win the match," Head Coach Bobby Kleinecke said. "We did not play extremely well in all facets, but we got another conference win."

A&M did not lose a set in singles play, winning all six matches in straight sets.

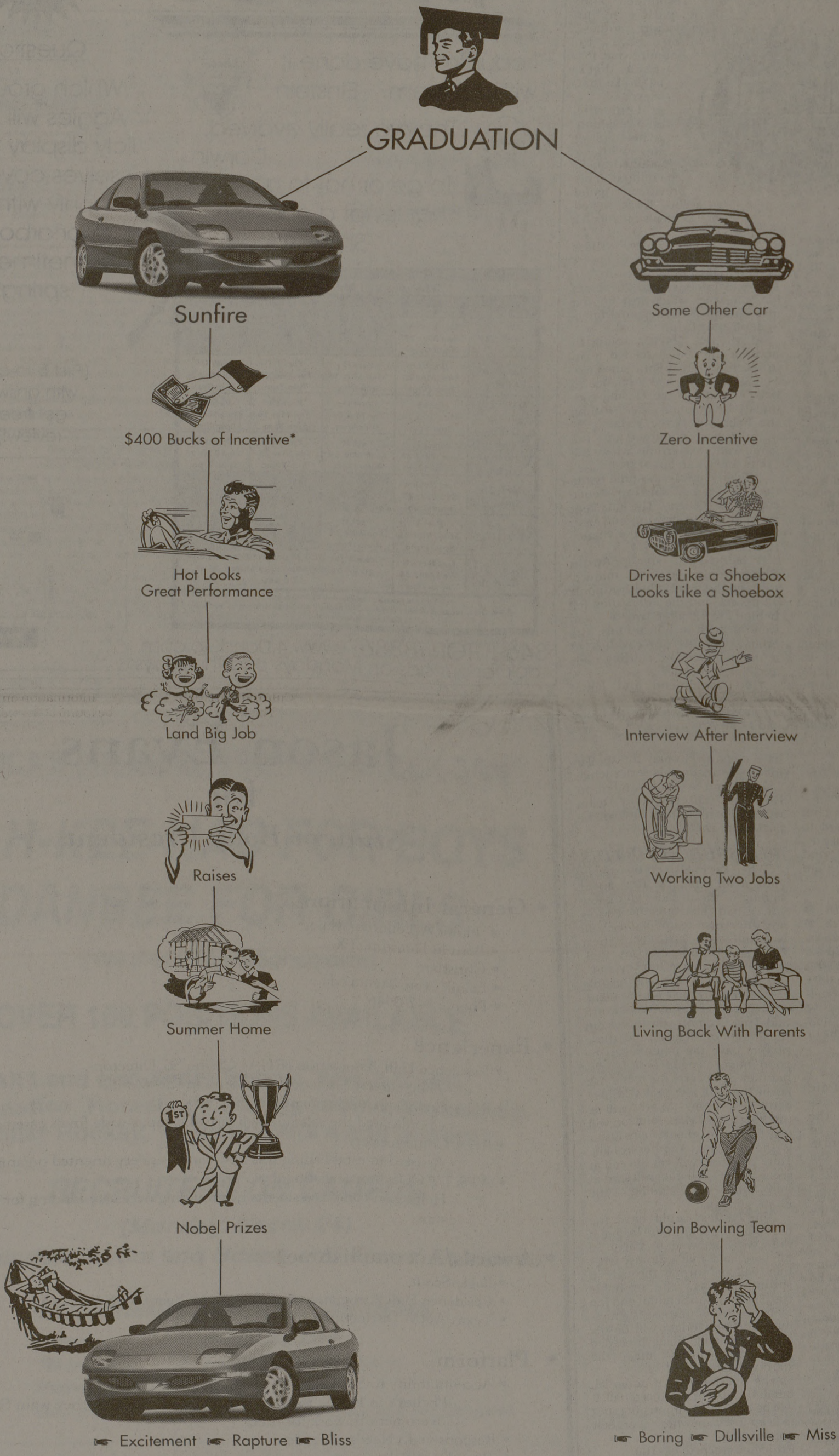
With a 6-2, 6-3 victory over Iowa State, senior Julie Beathin remained undefeated on the season, extending her record to 12-0.
