

Miller said the relaxed environment of the SI sessions are conducive to learning.

"It's more like studying with a group of friends," Miller said. "It is also helpful having a graduate student who has been in our shoes for the past few years — they understand things on our level."

Sam Mitchell, an SI student and a junior nutritional science major, said the SI leaders are the most important aspect of the program. She said they are always energetic and willing to go the extra mile to help out students.

"The SI leaders really care about you and want to ensure that you're learning," Mitchell said. "Their goal is to help the students rather than just get through with the session."

Miller said although a larger number of students now are attending the SI sessions, other students do not realize the effectiveness of the program. She said many students are involved in other activities that may conflict with the SI sessions.

"A lot of people see it, at first, as a waste of time," Miller said. "If they gave it a chance, they would take advantage of it more often."

Forcina said, in addition to holding three weekly help sessions, SI leaders should also serve as model students by always attending classes, taking good notes and asking questions in lecture.


