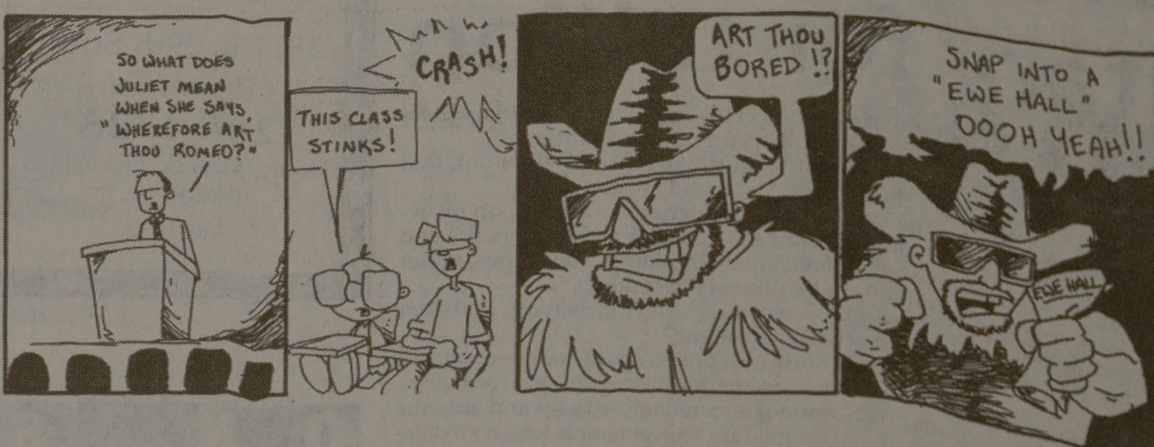

He said similar child care centers at other universities have been approved and those centers also were waiting lists.

"[The] Chancellor of the University of Texas says it's harder to get their day-care center than the school," Bowen said.

The finance and audit committee approved fees to be effective in 1998. If approved by the full board of regents for Texas residents and students will increase \$2 per semester credit hour. The student services fee will go from \$99 a semester to \$108. The computer fee will go from \$75 a semester to \$90; the student center fee will go from \$24 a semester to \$45 for a 15-hour semester and the library fee will go from \$292 MSC from 9:30 a.m. to 10 a.m. Students are welcome to attend

"Swadhyaya teaches that there is truth, that we are all created in the image of God, resides in all religions," Unterberger said. "We all have talents and attributes that any loving Creator would give His children. Our most precious source is the human mind."

Athavale, an educated scholar, does not accept money to advance her teachings, and his philosophy is housed by an organization. He, however, attracted the largest and most peaceful and enthusiastic crowds since Gandhi, she said.

Unterberger visited many villages exposed to Athavale's teachings and noted dramatic changes in their ways of life.

There were no more poor or unemployed people, Unterberger said. Instead, submitting to their vices, the people were basing their domestic and personal habits on caring for others and protecting their environment for the love of God, she said.


"[Swadhyaya] has liberated millions from poverty and moral dissolution," Unterberger said.

For these reasons, she said, Athavale deserved to win the Templeton Prize more than anyone.

"I believe that the Dada's work is a model and example for personal and communal transformation that can be adapted and modified within the dominant cultures and philosophical by of people all over the world," she said.
