Lawmakers blamed the Hopwood ruling for a recent decline in minority enrollment at UT and A&M.

Ashlock said the ruling has hurt most by affecting schools' ability to give financial aid and scholarships.

"We have to tell students that we could have helped them with a minority scholarship that was in place two years ago," Ashlock said. "And they'll say, 'Well, the University of Oklahoma has a scholarship like that waiting for me right now.' And they leave the state. It hurts us."

UT officials had said if the earlier version of Wilson's bill became law that Texas schools would be forced out of the Big 12 and millions of dollars in athletic revenue would be lost.






