Gonzalez homered twice, including his first grand slam in the majors, and matched his career high with six RBIs as the Houston Astros routed the Montreal Expos 9-0 Sunday and completed a three-game sweep.

That was plenty for Darryl Kile (13-3), who pitched a four-hitter for his fourth shutout this season and lowered his ERA to 1.99.


