## Olympic bombing victim remembered with prayers

Moment of silence marked anniversary of tragedy

ATLANTA (AP) — It was a hard moment for John Hawthorne — standing in Centennial Olympic Park Sunday and remembering how his wife was killed a year ago in a bomb blast just a few feet away.

As he watched children run through the park's now-famous dancing fountains, Hawthorne's eyes filled with tears and his voice trembled as he told about 200 people at a prayer service that his wife must not be forgotten.

"She would have been there taking pictures or been in there getting wet with them," he said, staring at the fountains. "She really would have liked it."

The bomb killed 44-year-old Alice Hawthorne of Albany, Ga., who brought her 14-year-old daughter to the park as a pre-birth-day treat. Her daughter and more than 100 others were injured.

Atlanta marked the first anniversary of the tragedy by shutting off the fountains and observing a moment of silence.

"Whenever we remember the special time in the summer of 1996, we will remember Alice Hawthorne," Mayor Bill Campbell told the audience. "Atlanta and Alice Hawthorne ... will forever be linked."

During the service, Hawthorne's daughter — Fallon Stubbs — stood somber, flanked by family members. The wounds she suffered from the bomb's flying shrapnel have

healed and she plans to undergo cosmetic surgery.

"Time has taken away some of the pain," she said. "It's hard today ... to be here. But it looks real nice."

A short distance away, a held up a large placard with message for the park bomb "Please Surrender."

There have been no arrests the bombing. Federal officials believe the bomber also is responsible for other Atlanta bombings — one at an abortion clinic, another at a gay nightclub.

Federal agents have released composite sketches of people who were in the park where the bomb was left, and have made wide appeals for film and videotape of the area. They have a free tip line, an information on the Internet, and say they had thousands of leads.

## Sex abuse plaintiffs choose to not attend mass service

CORSICANA (AP) — Bishop Charles Grahmann wanted to look into the eyes of the men who as boys were sexually abused by a now-suspended priest and tell them he is sorry.

On Sunday, at least, the victims who successfully sued former priest Rudolph "Rudy" Kos and the Catholic Diocese of Dallas for \$119.6 million weren't interested in hearing from Grahmann.

The 10 men had planned to attend mass at Immaculate Conception Catholic Church in Corsicana as a gesture of thanks to the Rev. Robert Williams, who works at the church and whose testimony against Kos helped win the case.

But they changed their minds once they heard that Grahmann, blamed by some for failing to stop the abuse and for waiting too long to acknowledge a problem, would attend the service.

"(We) just didn't want this to turn into a PR event down there for either us or the bishop," said plaintiff Wade Schlosstein.

"My clients just want to rest and we appreciate anything the bishop is willing to do and certainly encourage him to do more," said attorney Sylvia Demarest, who represented three of the plaintiffs.

Williams said the victims would hear from church officials when they're ready.

"I think at some time they need to listen to the bishop," the priest told The Associated Press.

Williams said a diocesan official called him Saturday and asked about the bishop's appearance. Williams thought an apology welcome but also called some of the plaintiffs to let them know Grahmann's plans.

Williams said he was hopeful Kos' victims would attend a mass in his parish later.

In his talk to the congregation Sunday, Grahmann issued his most contrite public statement regarding Kos and the church's involvement in the case.

"I wanted to look into the eyes of each of the victims and say to them from the most intimate part of my being that I am profoundly sorry," he said. "I promise that I will do everything possible to make sure this never ever happens again."

"I am profoundly sorry. I apologize to each one of them personally and I want to embrace them."

The 10 men and the parents of a teen-ager who committed suicide after abuse by Kos sued the former priest and the diocese alleging years of sexual abuse during in 1992.

Jurors decided Thursday the diocese was grossly negligent and concealed information in handling of sexual abuse complaints lodged against Kos, 52.

Williams and Kos were fellow priests at a parish in 1991, where Williams reported to the diocese Kos' inappropriate contact with boys. Williams testified in great detail at the trial.

## Key West celebrates Hemingway with annual festival despite feud

KEY WEST, Fla. (AP) — Look-alikes with silver-white beards wearing khaki shorts flocked to town as they have each July for years, to drink, carouse and see who looks most like Papa Hemingway.

They would have come no matter what. Still, the festival they love so much almost did not happen this year.

Eager to cash in on the annual Hemingway Days festival, three sons of the late Nobel Prize-winning novelist demanded 10 percent of the profits, telling organizers they were using the family name without paying any licensing fee.

They also said they were tired of rowdy Key West and wanted to make the event more dignified.

Fearing a costly legal battle, the original founder called this year's festival off, but the owner of the local Hemingway house later bought rights to the festival name and promised to carry on regardless.

So for the 17th year, the festival celebrating Ernest Hemingway went on largely as planned this weekend. It did not matter that the legal dispute with the three Hemingway sons — Jack, Patrick and Gregory — remained unsettled.

"We were worried about it,"

said Fred Johnson, the president of the newly formed Hemingway Lookalike Society. "We decided we were coming anyway, festive or no festival."

Key West was a favorite haunt of Hemingway's, a then isolated seaside spot where he lived and drank and raised children and told stories for most of the 1930s. As Key West is also where he wrote some of his most beloved work.

"Papa liked it here," said Richard "Bart" Barton, this year's Hemingway look-alike winner. "This is where it should be."

Hemingway descendants held another festival a week ago at Sanibel Island about 150 miles away, an island Hemingway never visited, creating a family event in contrast Key West's wild party atmosphere.

In Key West, visitors gathered by the dozens Saturday in front of the two-story, Spanish-style house shaded by banyan trees and palms where the writer once lived.

Some Hemingway look-alikes told stories about Papa. Billy Young told of meeting the great writer at a hotel in Spain and the bullfights.
