Robert Kennedy, vice president for research and associate provost for graduate studies, said, "The figures reflect the overall commitment of the campus to make our doctoral programs more inclusive." Kennedy credits these results to the efforts of faculty, staff, administrators and graduate students. Robertson also said minority graduate students help new minority graduate students. "There are African-American and Hispanic student programs that are put on that are student to student," he said. "Current minority students are trying to transfer the experience in a way to new graduate students to share their learning curve."

Robertson said such programs help graduate students learn about the University. "Nothing takes the place of talking to someone with experience," he said. Robertson said the programs are an "equivalent to Fish Camp" for new undergraduate students. "These programs give new graduate students, many of which are out-of-state students, a chance to hear things that go beyond what it is in the catalog," he said. "What these students do will help us in retention in years to come." A&M also tied for third place and placed fifth and 11th in the number of doctoral degrees awarded in engineering technology, computer science and math for African Americans, Hispanics and Asian Americans, respectively. In the publication's July 10 issue, which presented similar

lists for undergraduate degrees, A&M ranked 31st in the number of baccalaureate degrees awarded, minority students in all fields and 12th in such degrees awarded to Hispanic students.

In other lists of undergraduate degrees awarded to Hispanic A&M ranked second in engineering technology, computer science and math; third in both engineering and physical sciences; seventh in biology; 20th in English language/literature/letters and 23rd in life sciences, business/management and communications. The University of California, Los Angeles awarded the most doctoral degrees in 1994-95 with 145, and the University of Texas placed seventh with 84. The figures are based on the magazine's analysis of U.S. Department of Education data reported by the nation's institutions of higher learning. *Black Issues* publishes the reports annually in July.

UPD Director Bob Wiatt said the move will not hinder UPD's service — the department will move in shifts to minimize service problems. "I don't see any problems, but it is going to put an extra burden on us," Wiatt said. Wiatt also said Research Park is an ideal location for A&M's growing police force, especially because West Campus is expanding and the site is near the George Bush Presidential Library Complex.

"The fact that we're over here, just as good as us being over here," Wiatt said. The Department of Environmental Health and Safety, which is responsible for radiation and chemical safety at A&M, and some Human Resources divisions will share the other half of the Research Park building. Chris Meyer, director of environmental health and safety, said the department will not gain any space but will have better-equipped facilities for campus health and safety classes. "One of the grand things we'll get is a real training room," Meyer said. "We've never had a training facility of our own."

Human Resources Director Susan Irza said the department has offices on and off campus but only benefits, immigration services, training and professional development, employee relations and the department's administrative offices will be relocated to Research Park. She said the department "jumped at the chance" to move these offices to a new location. The Research Park building will have a parking lot, and Irza said the department's main motivation in moving was to give customers easier access to Human Resources. "We're eager," she said. "We're delighted to move out. It's a real benefit for employee service because it will be so much easier for employees to get to us."

development, employee relations and the department's administrative offices will be relocated to Research Park.

She said the department "jumped at the chance" to move these offices to a new location. The Research Park building will have a parking lot, and Irza said the department's main motivation in moving was to give customers easier access to Human Resources. "We're eager," she said. "We're delighted to move out. It's a real benefit for employee service because it will be so much easier for employees to get to us."

Human Resources will move in December because the fall is traditionally a busy period for the department, Irza said. Also, Human Resources does not face a move-out deadline, as does UPD and environmental health and safety.

The Texas A&M Foundation will break ground on its building on Sept. 25, said Rose Anne Thomas, manager of communications for the Foundation. The Foundation, which manages private gifts to the University, will then be across street from its sister organization, the Association of Former Students, which is at the Clayton Williams Jr., Alumni Center. The Foundation building is now at Dominick and Texas Avenue.

"It made a lot of sense, given the teamwork between the two organizations to be across from the Clayton Williams Center," Thomas said.
