Sixteenth-ranked A&M looks Bo to spike SWT in home opener Profe

Laurie Corbelli will lead the 16th-ranked Texas Aggie Volleyball team into action tonight against Southwest Texas State University with hopes that the Aggies will make this one of many victories this season. The team entered the season as the 13th-ranked team in the country and after tough losses to the former first-ranked Stanford and the eighth-ranked BYU Cougars, the Aggies have returned with a vengeance to win three straight matches and win the University of Georgia Tournament.

The team is focused on a number of goals this season according to Coach Corbelli.
