Eagles fly higher than Packers, 10-9

Eagles 10, Packers 9
 Rookie Ryan Longwell missed what would have been the game-winning field goal with 11 seconds left, and Ty Detmer threw for the game's only touchdown with 1:56 left as the Philadelphia Eagles upset the defending Super Bowl champions 10-9 Sunday.
 Longwell, who hadn't missed a field goal attempt in either the exhibition or regular season, was wide right from 28 yards out, touching off a wild celebration at Veterans Stadium.
 The Packers (1-1) lost for the first time in 10 games, including their playoff run to the championship last year.

Patriots 31, Colts 6
 Four touchdown passes in a game is getting to be a habit for New England's Drew Bledsoe.
 Bledsoe did it for the second consecutive week as New England defeated the Indianapolis Colts 31-6 Sunday.
Chargers 20, Saints 6
 Jim Everett got even.
 Everett beat his old team and coach Mike Ditka, the man who cut him, as the San Diego Chargers defeated the New Orleans Saints 20-6 Sunday.

Panthers 9, Falcons 6
 The clock was ticking toward 0:00 and it didn't look like the Carolina Panthers would get off another play.
 But Steve Beuerlein managed to down the ball with one second left and John Kasay followed with his third field goal of the fourth quarter, a 39-yarder that gave the Panthers a 9-6 victory Sunday over the Atlanta Falcons.

Vikings 27, Bears 24
 Brad Johnson worked the clock, kept his poise and passed the Minnesota Vikings to a last-second victory over the Chicago Bears.
 Johnson hit Chris Walsh on a 9-yard touchdown pass with 37 seconds to go Sunday to rally the Vikings to a 27-24 victory.

49ers 15, Rams 12
 No, Jim Druckenmiller isn't Steve Young. But he still did what San Francisco quarterbacks have done all decade — beat the Rams.
 Druckenmiller, who reported to the 49ers just four weeks ago after being their No. 1 pick in the April draft, threw two TD passes as the 49ers won their 14th straight game over the Rams, 15-12 Sunday.

Ravens 23, Bengals 10
 For a change, the Baltimore Ravens came up with all the key plays in the fourth quarter.
 Vinny Testaverde threw a pivotal touchdown pass to Eric Green with 9:36 left and the Ravens avoided their patented late collapse Sunday in a 23-10 victory over the Cincinnati Bengals.

Steelers 14, Redskins 13
 The Pittsburgh Steelers got back to what they do best — giving the ball to Jerome Bettis and getting out of his way — while Gus Frerotte kept doing what he does worst.
 Bettis carried on all but two plays on a 72-yard fourth-quarter scoring drive, rallying Pittsburgh (1-1) past the mistake-riddled Washington Redskins, 14-13 Sunday.

Dolphins 16, Oilers 13
 Following a week of criticism — some of it from his coach — Marino bounced back from a poor performance in the season opener to rally the Miami Dolphins past the Tennessee Oilers 16-13 in overtime Sunday.

Buccaneers 24, Lions 17
 Tampa Bay rookie Warrick Dunn had Detroit fans thinking Barry Sanders was in the wrong uniform. The vastly improved Buccaneers' defense made Sanders wish he was.
 Dunn carried 24 times for 130 yards, including a 6-yard touchdown as the Bucs beat the struggling Lions 24-17 Sunday. It was the first 2-0 start since 1992 for the Bucs, who went 0-5 to start last season.

Bills 28, N.Y. Jets 22
 The Buffalo Bills, coming off a loss at home in their opener, beat the Jets 28-22 Sunday, their fifth straight win on New York's field and the 17th in the last 20 meetings.
 In a game of big plays, Todd Collins made the most with three touchdown passes, looking as effective as Jim Kelly, the man he has replaced at quarterback for Buffalo. And the Bills' defense, led by Bryce Paup, had eight sacks.

Broncos 35, Seahawks 14
 John Elway passed for two touchdowns to Ed McCaffrey on Sunday, leading Denver to a 35-14 victory over the Seahawks in a game the Broncos trailed 14-13 at halftime.

Jaguars 40, N.Y. Giants 13
 Just more than two weeks after he was claimed off waivers, Steve Matthews played with poise in his first NFL start and led the Jaguars to their highest point total ever with a 40-13 victory over the New York Giants on Sunday.




