

Texas A&M participated in a college alcohol study done by the Har-vard School of Public Health in October 1994.

More than 70 percent of the students surveyed at A&M had used alcohol in the past 30 days, and 70 percent of underage students had indicated use. Also, 41.9 percent of A&M students said they have driven after drinking alcohol, compared to 30.3 percent for other large public universities. More than 20 percent drove after 5 or more drinks, compared with 11 percent for other schools.

Hanson said the IFC has its own set of drinking policies that includes many of the Residence Hall Association regulations. The IFC requires an identification program, hired security, servers and a designated-driver program at open parties, as well as providing non-alcoholic drinks.

Feather said the Corps of Cadets follows RHA policy for alcohol consumption. This policy allows students 21 and over to drink in residence halls if they are behind closed doors.




