During finals week, Keen would go to Bryan and rent cheap motel rooms to study.

"My house was a great place to be and a really lousy place to study," Keen said.

"I always feel like I'm coming home," Keen said.

Keen grew up in Houston. He always listened to country music. He was a big fan of pre-pigtailed Willie Nelson and Marty Robbins' three piece suit.

Keen said he is currently listening to a Marty Robbins album that he has heard a million times. He also listens to Fred Eagle Smith, a singer-songwriter from Canada.
