Sawyer said he did not know where to turn until his father came to him.

"My dad's a recovering alcoholic, so he knows pain," he said. "My dad was my strength, and when I saw him cry for me, it killed me. He told me God was the only one who could help."

Sawyer said he talked to God that night. Within weeks, his white blood cell count returned to normal and he gained all of the weight back. Sawyer graduated from high school on time and with honors.

Sawyer then went to college, where he met his best friend, Brent. "Brent shattered my stereotype of a Christian," he said. "He wasn't a hyp-

More than two years ago, while a sophomore in college, Sawyer was given six months to live. He decided to leave college and speak to students across the nation about the HIV virus and AIDS.

"After people find out I have AIDS, they really don't treat me any differently," Sawyer said. "I've never really experienced any negative reactions from people."

Mark Hurt, campus director of Campus Crusade for Christ, said Sawyer helps young people realize how short life can be.

"Steve is dying," Hurt said, "and I think as a 20- or 22-year-old, people don't think about dying. Life is short ... how are people this age going to deal with dying?"

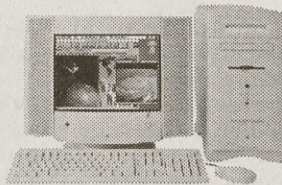

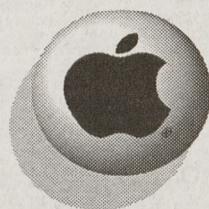

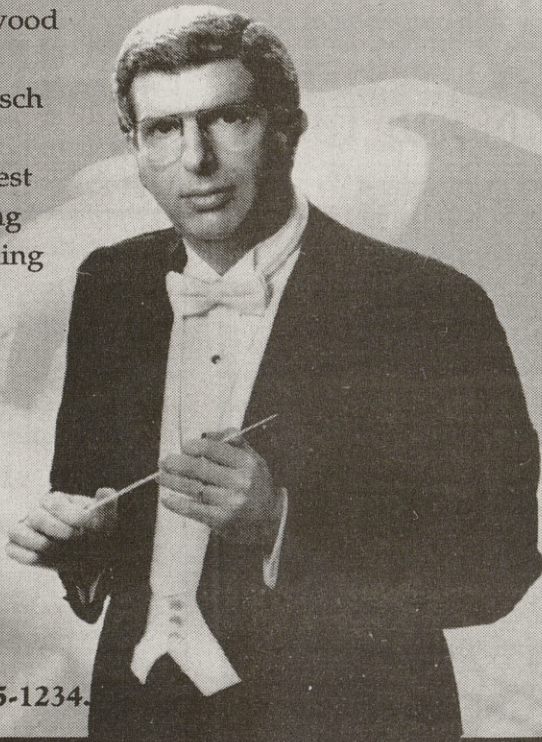
