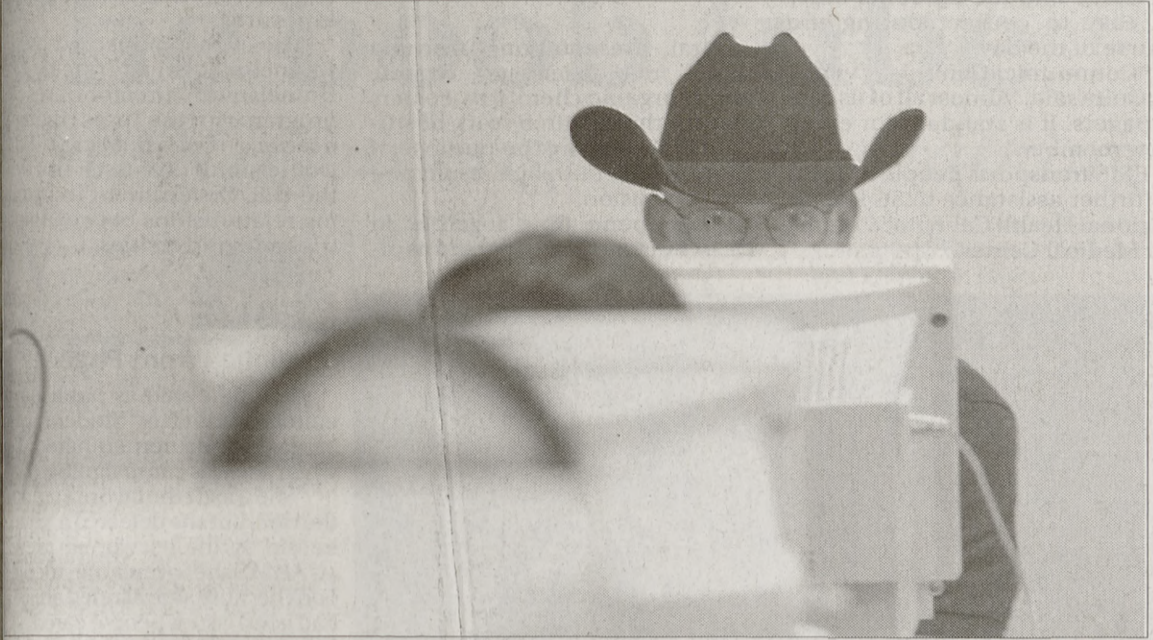

# Burger Boy ordered to vacate

STAFF AND WIRE REPORT

George and Tara Sopasakis, owners of Burger Boy Restaurant, have ordered to vacate 301 Patricia on or before Oct. 15 by an order issued by Federal District Judge Kenneth M. Hoyt. The amount to be paid to the Sopasakis for relocation funds will be determined by the City of College Station.

Station's Community Development Office that is acting on the behalf of the Department of Housing and Urban Development.

If Sopasakis and the city disagree on the amount of relocation funds, Hoyt will determine the amount to be paid.

Todd McDaniel, the Northgate Revitalization coordinator, said a compromise with Burger Boy should be reached.

"I'm told the City of College Station is confident that a settlement will be reached soon and we can all get back to business," he said.

McDaniel said the city wants settle the dispute.

"It's been a long conflict for both parties and hopefully it will end soon," he said.

The order was signed by Hoyt Sept. 26.

## Letter from Curtis Childers regarding tonight's forum

There is a racial problem on campus.

If you do not agree with me, then I want you to come to 206 MSC tonight at 8:30 p.m. to tell me.

If you do believe me, then I want you to come to 206 MSC tonight to be a part of figuring out what we, as students, can do about it. Our leadership is so important right now.

There are many parties on campus who are concerned about the effects of *Hopwood* and minority enrollment. There are a lot of different opinions about the diversity issue at the admissions problems. These are important concerns, but tonight we will not be addressing them.

Tonight we will be talking about how we can ensure that all students on campus get a quality "Aggie" experience while they are here on campus. The facts tell us that minority involvement in historical traditions at A&M is low. To me, that means that there are some students who are not getting the quality experience that they should while they are here. Some students do not feel welcome at this University or in Aggie traditions. That's a problem.

Who's to blame? I suppose there are two right answers: everyone and no one. We have all settled into a system that does not appeal to all students. "Highway 6 runs both ways" is not a response I will tolerate. Instead, it is time Aggies, as keepers of tradition, make an effort to include everyone.

The racial problem here is not isolated from the rest of society. In many places in our country, races are still segregated in living areas, economic status and social class. This is not the issue. The problem comes when

people, through ignorance, do not learn how to work with people of other races because of natural or created separations. In society, ignorance manifests itself into racism of all sorts, overt and subtle, conscious and unconscious.

We can not change the law. We can not change all society. But we can lessen our ignorance. I am calling leaders across campus to lead in that cause. You owe it to your University to help make a difference. I can not think of another function that needs the spirit of the 12th Man more.

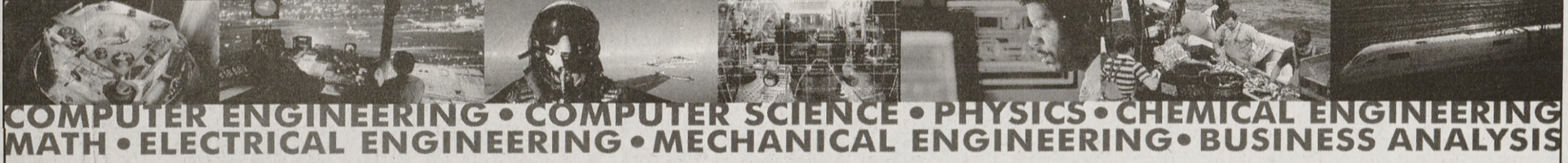

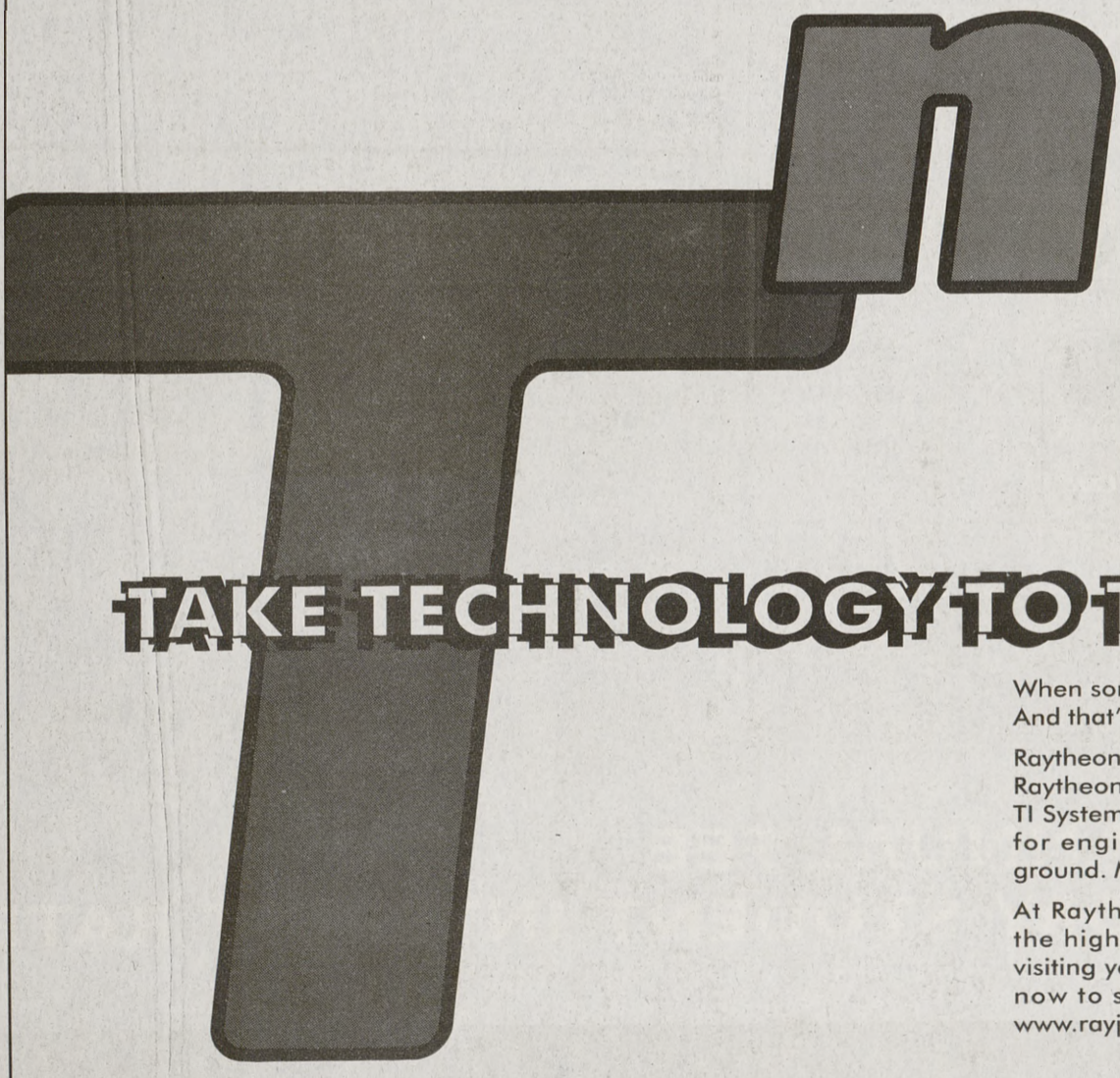
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
