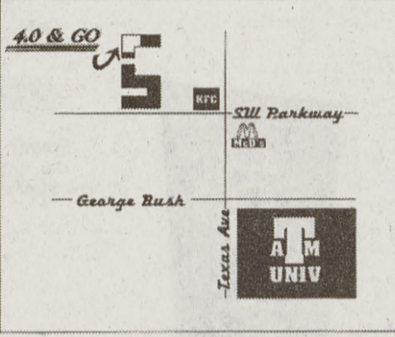

## Top enlisted soldier moves closer to trial

### Sgt. Maj. Gene McKinney faces court-martial on 22 counts

WASHINGTON (AP) — The sexual misconduct case against Sgt. Maj. of the Army Gene McKinney moved within a step of trial Wednesday when a reviewing officer concurred with a recommendation that McKinney be court-martialed.

Col. Owen Powell sent his report to Maj. Gen. Robert Foley, who will make the final decision on whether McKinney should stand trial.

Six women have alleged that McKinney made improper sexual advances toward them.

All six testified at a Fort McNair hearing to determine if there was sufficient evidence to order a court-

sources close to the case, speaking on condition of anonymity, confirmed that both officers recommended the matter go to trial.

The brief Army announcement said that Foley could dismiss the charges, order nonjudicial action, return the case to Powell for disposition or order a general court-martial.

Charles Gittins, McKinney's civilian lawyer, has said that if a court-martial is ordered he will file a motion detailing cases in which general officers accused of the same activity alleged against McKinney were not threatened with prosecution. He said the officers were allowed to retire with full benefits.

Earlier this week, Gittins filed a motion denouncing the Jarvis report as "flimsy and superficial."

He said that Jarvis' 1 1/2-page report had "no critical analysis of the evidence or explanation of what circumstances required the testimony of 56 witnesses."

The defense also said the Jarvis report included no discussion "of evidence contradictory of the complaining witnesses."

Meanwhile, on Capitol Hill, House and Senate negotiators agreed to reinforce the Army's training command in light of the sex scandal that rocked a training center at Aberdeen Proving Ground, Md.

## Clinton accuses trade partners of unfair practices toward U.S.

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Clinton administration today accused South Korea, Japan, Canada, the European Union and Australia of unfair trade practices, starting a process that could eventually lead to economic sanctions.

The charge against South Korea came despite 11th-hour negotiations held over the past several days in which the South Koreans sought to keep from being singled out under a provision of U.S. trade law known as Super 301.

That provision allows the president to launch investigations of unfair trade practices against countries and to impose punitive tariffs

if negotiations to remove the barriers are not successful.

U.S. Trade Representative Charlene Barshefsky announced that such a case was being brought against Korea because negotiations between the two countries had failed to resolve all of the U.S. complaints.

"Korea was not prepared to undertake the reforms that are necessary for

real opening of their auto market," Barshefsky said in a statement.

She said despite South Korea's commitments in 1995, sales of foreign cars make up less than 1 percent of the Korean market.

The U.S. auto industry had urged that both South Korea and Japan be cited as part of the administration's annual Super 301 review, a process by which it targets countries deemed to have erected the most harmful barriers against American products.

Instead, it cited Japan, Canada and the 15-nation European Union and Australia for other alleged unfair practices.

## Computer mogul headed to court

AUSTIN (AP) — Computer company founder Michael Dell is headed to court over the property tax appraisal on his new, 33,000-square-foot house.

The Travis Central Appraisal District says the house, located on 60 acres of prime land west of Austin, was worth \$22.5 million on Jan. 1. The tax bill would be about \$600,000.

Dell and his wife, Susan, say the

home, which will be completed later this year, should be valued between \$5.5 million and \$6.5 million. That tax bill would be about \$160,000, the Austin American-Statesman reported Wednesday.

Dell Computer is Austin's second-largest private employer. Dell's stock in the company is valued at more than \$5.8 billion.

"I can assure you Mr. Dell wants to pay his fair share of whatever property taxes are owed," said Peter Winstead, the Dells' lawyer. "But just because he's Michael Dell doesn't mean he should pay more than the market value of his house."

A key issue is whether the house should be appraised on what it cost to build or its fair market value — what it would sell for. Another point of contention is how much of the house was completed on Jan. 1, 1997. The Dells say 57 percent; the district says 80 percent.

According to an initial appraisal hearing, the three-story, granite, stainless steel and limestone house will include eight bedrooms — including servants' quarters — eight bathrooms and 13 half-baths, a conference room, a commercial-grade kitchen, an exercise room, tennis courts and an indoor lap pool.

The Dells' house is more than twice the size of the next largest house in the county and is easily the most expensive ever built in the area, the American-Statesman reported.

In their lawsuit, the Dells say the district arbitrarily placed a "fundamentally wrong value" on their property far in excess of fair market value.

Art Cory, chief appraiser for the district, acknowledges that the appraisal might not be accurate. Appraisers haven't been allowed onto the property, he told the newspaper.

"We've made every reasonable attempt to get on the property, and we're still getting denied," Cory said. "I understand Mr. Dell's concern about security. But at the same time, it's difficult to appraise a piece of property without being able to look at it."

The Dells' lawyer said they were making arrangements to let county appraisers onto the property in the next week.

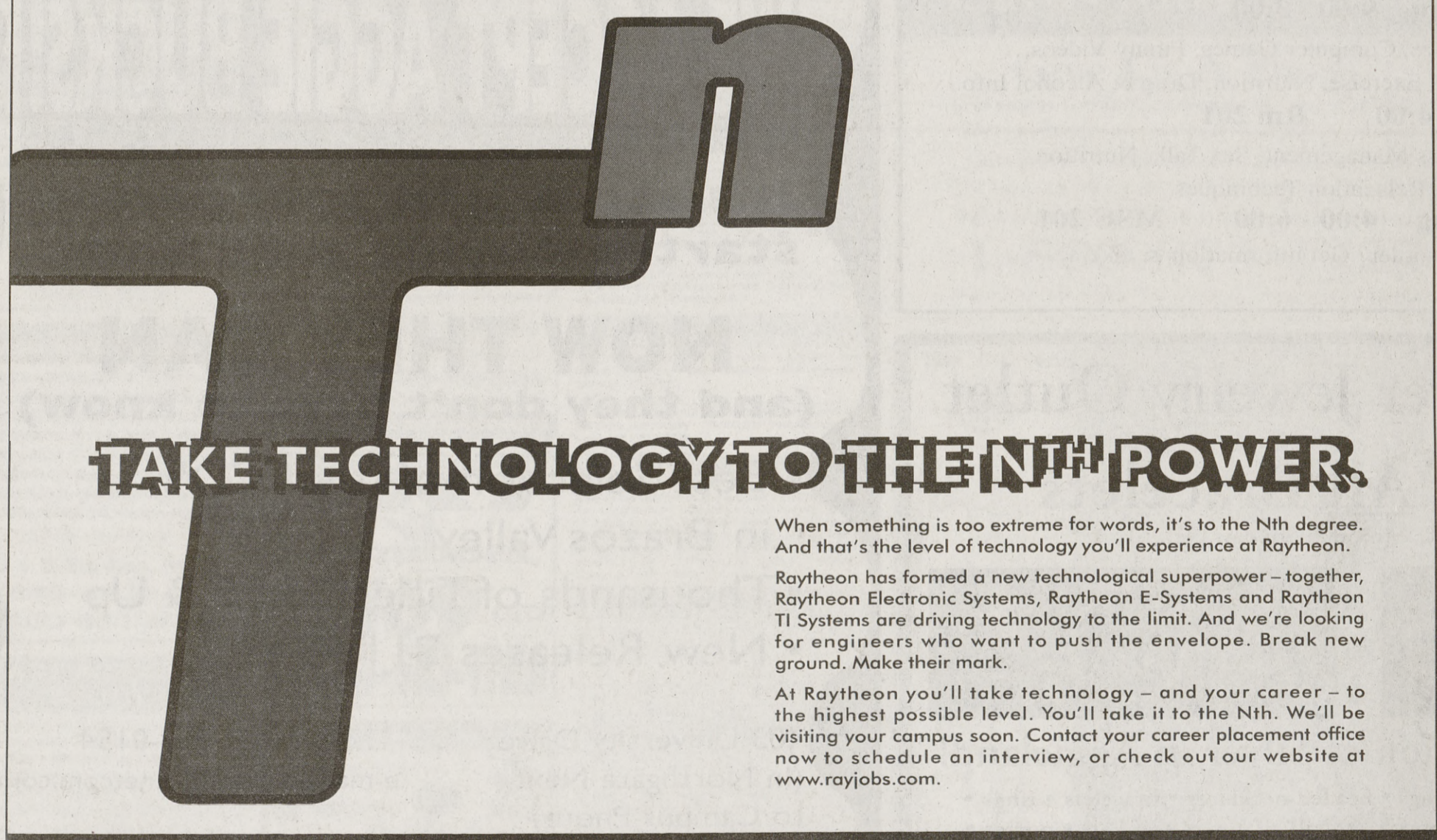
The average single-family home in Travis County is valued at \$124,433, with an average annual property tax bill of \$3,100.
