The University of Houston Cougars Volleyball Team realized it was in for a tough night after serving the first side out directly into the back of Cougar middle hitter Jenny Kniss.

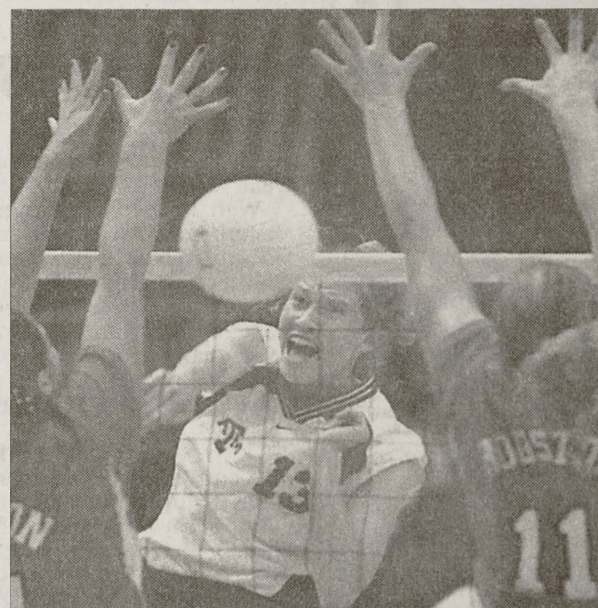
The Cougars recovered from that embarrassment and rallied to give the Texas A&M Volleyball Team a tough battle, but never mustered enough to gain a victory in any single game.

### Golf wins second at Big 12 Preview

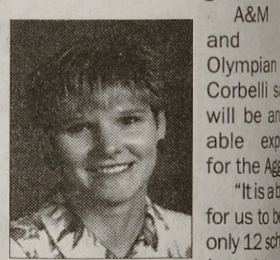
