



NEW YORK (AP) - Sigourney Weaver is a vision as she opens the door of her hotel room - a long, slinky mink of a woman clad in a sheer, bloodred corset shirt with a fitted black skirt.

One other thing: She is barefoot.

It is a telling detail. While Sigourney Weaver may be every inch the urbane New York sophisticate - an actress with both a pedigree and an lvy






