Senate hears finance proposale

The Student Senate referred to committee the Student Government Association Budgetary Process Bill and the Election Regulations Revision Bill Wednesday night.

Amy Magee, Rules and Regulations chair and a senior psychology major, said the budgetary process bill laid out the method used in the Senate this year to appropriate spending by Student Government.

"The process for allocation worked very well this year," she said. "Previously, there was no set budget

policy, and often each president handled it very differently. This bill makes sure that there is an appropriate appeals process for committees who feel money should be allocated differently.'

The Election Regulations Revisions Bill would ban the use of copyrighted symbols for campaign material to avoid legal entanglements by student candidates.
