Yates said the people in the program listen to students with religious concerns or problems.

'We determine if we can be of help, and if we can't, we refer the student to the proper source," he said. "We are not there to convert people, but to serve the community where it is. We abide by a code of ethics that says we do not use any underhanded or coercive methods of counseling. We want to be of service to those with a spiritual struggle or any other problems."
