"Intoxication and alcohol abuse is a huge problem since this is a college town," Price said. "The program makes our jobs easier because the students get to see for themselves the dangers of alcohol abuse. Once the students see what problems alcohol can cause, the word

will get out to others." Price also said the program creates a healthier relationship between officers and students. He said that within the A&M community students often view cops as the "bad guys." He said that seeing things from the cops' perspective increases cooperation. Price said alcohol abuse is becoming a larger problem within

the community. "Let's say you are at a party about fifty people there. There are about 50 to 100 parties with at least a number of people at each. When you mix that with alcohol there are a lot of problems. Once students see that alcohol can save lives."
