Earth Info. Did you know...?

Volcanoes occur where the earth's plates are either colliding or separating.

Magma rises from Earth's asthenosphere into a magma chamber deep below a volcano. This subsurface magma produces tremendous heat that can boil groundwater, as seen in the hot springs and geysers of Yellowstone National Park.

Upon erupting, the magma, called lava, builds landforms including cinder cones, calderas, composite volcanoes, shield volcanoes, and plateau basalts.
