Texas A&M football Coach R.C. Slocum and A&M men's basketball Coach Tony Barone will participate in readings for children.


Aggies over Texas will provide skydiving exhibitions throughout the day.

utting party alliances aside, President Bill Clinton and his wife, Hillary, showed poise and enthusiasm as the dedication of the George Bush Presidential Library and Museum unfolded.

Clinton outlined policies former President George Bush began during his administration, which Clinton plans to continue.

Clinton said he is faced with a problem similar to what Bush faced during his presidency. 'The vigilance President Bush displayed in dealing with Iraq, as we all know, is required again today," Clinton said. "And I be-

lieve the American people support that vigilance, thanks in no small measure to [Bush's] example not so long ago.' Saddam Hussein prompted United States concern when he did not allow American

weapons inspectors from the United Nations' teams to enter Iraq. Clinton addressed Bush's success in

launching NAFTA and talks that produced the World Trade Organization.

Clinton said he was proud to complete the efforts of Bush and thankful for support from the former president.

"I am grateful for the support [Bush] continues to give, along with our other former Presidents, to the imperative of American leadership in expanding alliances of trade, Clinton said, "not only for our economic welfare, but to support our political ideals."

Clinton said the House of Representatives will vote today on whether to extend fasttrack authority to negotiate trade agree-

"I hope Congress will follow the lead that President Bush and other former presidents have set to expand trade and our vital horizons in the 21st century," he said.
