



Wylie said that some students may abuse the program, and let resentment about a grade get in the way of the program's goals.

A student might be angry over a grade they received in a class, and use this forum to vent their frustrations," he said. "In my mind, no good thing can come from this program, and I think the risks of getting good results are just too hazardous to take.

Wylie said Texas A&M should look to other universities to find ways for students to express their opinions about classes and professors.

We could look for other alternatives to this program, other models of different forums that don't run the risk of putting a wedge between the student and faculty groups, something with a more positive environment," he said.
