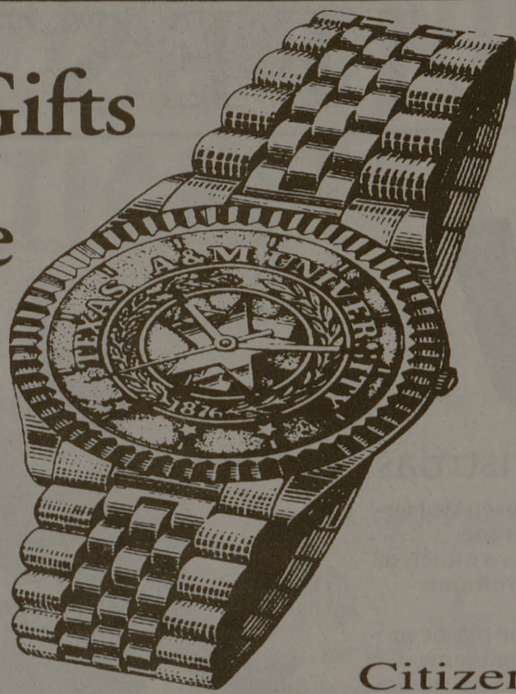

The museum's rock and mineral presentation also allows students to study the rocks up-close rather than having to look at them through a glass case.

The museum also offers summer, spring and winter camps for children and programs that help acquaint children with animals.

The Discovery Room is a section of the museum that houses live animals, including turtles, snakes and other various reptiles. The museum also offers a program called Babies and Beasts.

It is designed to show children as young as 18 months how to get

along with nature.

The Brazos Valley Museum of Natural History is the only institution of its kind within a 100-mile radius of Bryan-College Station, and according to a public service announcement, "The museum teaches respect and appreciation for the region's natural history and informs people about the natural world of our ancestors and our place in the natural world today."

Huey said the museum's mission is to help people understand what has happened in the Brazos Valley.

Beginning Jan. 16, the museum will showcase a traveling exhibit on dinosaurs.

The museum's regular business hours are Tuesday through Satur-

day from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m.

The exhibit will be on display until April 19, and the museum will be accepting volunteers to help with the exhibit. Store clerks and other staff members are all positions that must be filled.

On Thursday, Dec. 14, the museum is holding a Christmas party at the museum.

A \$5 donation will be required to see the Texas Woodpecker and Ruthie Woodpecker. The museum will continue to offer the educational programs in the community.

**Subject of 'Seinfeld' episode
proves costly for brewery**

MILWAUKEE (AP) — The show may be about nothing, but the lawsuit sparked by "Seinfeld" is costing a brewery a \$30 million bond.

A judge has ordered Miller Brewing Co. to post the amount while it appeals the more than \$24 million verdict against it in July for firing an executive who told a female co-worker about a racy episode of the TV show.

Jerold Mackenzie was fired in 1993 after Patricia Best complained.

In the episode, Jerry Seinfeld's character cannot remember his girlfriend's name but knows it rhymes with a part of the female anatomy.

**Members of Motley Crue
rough up security guard**

PHOENIX (AP) — Motley Crue drummer Tommy Lee and bassist Nikki Sixx were arrested on assault charges for allegedly knocking over a security guard during a concert.

The guard was bowled over by fans who rushed the America West Arena stage Wednesday at Lee's urging, said Sgt. Mike Torres, a police spokesman.

When the guard tried to hold audience members back, Lee and Sixx tackled him, Torres said.

Lee, the husband of former "Baywatch" star Pamela Anderson Lee, and Sixx were booked and re-

leased early Thursday.

Bob Machen, general manager of the arena, said the rush to the stage caused \$15,000 in damage.

**Otis Redding Jr. honored
Georgia's Music Hall of Fame**

MACON, Ga. (AP) — A tide of admirers came to Georgia's Music Hall of Fame for the opening ceremony of an exhibit dedicated to Otis Redding Jr.

Redding, a Macon native who died in a plane crash three years ago, wrote such hits as "Respect," "Sittin' on the Dock of the Bay" and "The Dock of the Bay."

The exhibit includes photographs, a poster, a record and Redding's Rock and Roll Hall of Fame 1989 induction trophy.

**Minneapolis welcomes
formerly known as Prince**

MINNEAPOLIS (AP) — Prince was welcomed home in his hometown after a 10-year self-imposed exile.

Prince, who changed his name to an unpronounceable symbol since the last time he played an arena show in Minneapolis, arrived Wednesday for a concert tour. About 14,000 fans attended the show.

"Did you miss me?" Prince, who has changed his name to an unpronounceable symbol, asked the crowd. "I missed you, too. Let's see if we can't make it tonight."

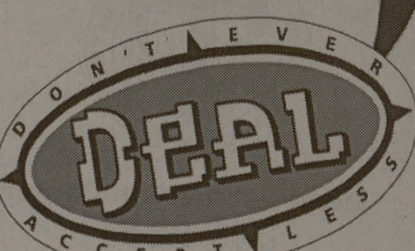

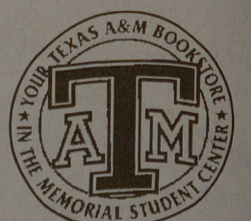
