

#### Oilers free to move to Nashville after buy

NASHVILLE, Tenn. (AP) — The Tennessee Oilers are free to negotiate a deal to play next season in Nashville under an agreement approved Tuesday by Memphis officials.

The Memphis and Shelby County Sports Authority and the Memphis Parks Commission signed a deal calling for the Oilers to pay them \$1.2 million to get out of a two-year contract to play in the Liberty Bowl. The city also will not refund the \$118,904 the team spent improving the stadium last year.

Under the agreement negotiated by the authority and the Oilers, the team has until April 30 to find another temporary stadium for this fall. If they do not, they may play a second season in Memphis.

'We're disappointed to see the Oilers go, but that's the way it is," said Wayne Boyer, executive director of the parks commission.






