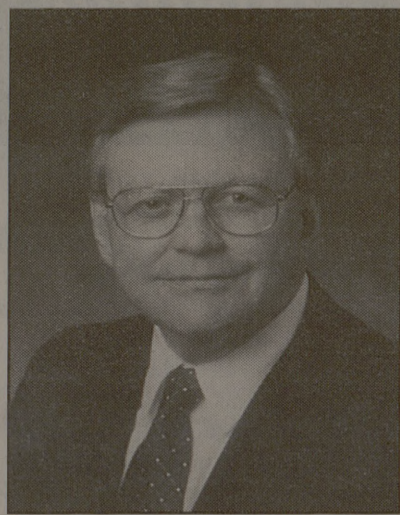

Cynthia Economos, a landscape architecture graduate student, said the project was a rare chance for the two departments to collaborate.

"It's a really good opportunity, and it actually affects something that's real, tangible and hopefully beneficial to Jerry Horton," Economos said.

Student designs are a master plan for a 30 to 50-person residential community and a summer camp for the mentally disabled. Facilities will include 20 to 30 buildings and could cost \$5 million to \$6 million to develop, Mann said.

The Hortons, who have been raising funds for the ranch since 1989, will use students' designs in fundraising efforts over the next few months. Funding is provided by individuals, churches, businesses and foundations.

Mr. Horton said the master plans give them something to show people when they ask for support.

"Having the prestige of George Mann, the College of Architecture and Texas A&M University," he said, "is going to be of immeasurable and incalculable future benefit."

"I feel that we all share a common ground and should work together," he said.

Rachel Allen, MSC council member and a junior speech communication major, said Kao played an instrumental role in ACE's formation.

"I think that Frank has done a wonderful job putting this together," she said. "The idea for the committee is timely and important, and I expect it to be a great success."

Kao, who is currently the only Asian student senator, encourages everyone to get involved because it helps people to be more open and understanding. This will dissolve prejudice, he said.

"Once we have a better understanding of each other, mutual understanding will follow," Kao said. "This will help bind us together."

Brenham man drowns in canoe accident

A Brenham man drowned Saturday after his canoe apparently capsized in a pond located on the property of the wood airport, which is owned and operated by Texas A&M University.

Divers from the College Station Police Department recovered the body of a man, 23, at 7:30 a.m. Saturday.

Texas A&M University student Voelkel accompanied Smith to the pond, which is located between Nueces Road and the airport's east side. Voelkel said Smith called for help on his attempt to cross the pond. Voelkel could not locate Smith's canoe until he called 911.

The University Police Department is still investigating, according to a spokesman. Justice of the Peace George Boyett ordered for Smith to be taken to the Bexar County Coroner's Office in San Antonio for an autopsy.

The pond, which is designated as a non-trespassing area, has been used by A&M classes and other organizations.
