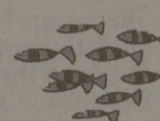
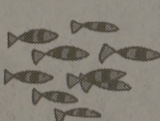

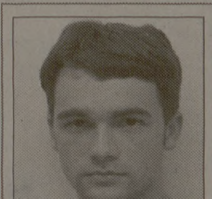

It was sad to see a Disney
movie working blue. In one

The only entertaining per-
formance is given by Ana
