

**Crawford goes on the road to promote**

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Christina Crawford isn't finished yet with her *Mommie Dearest*. Twenty years after publishing the tell-all book about being abused by her adoptive mother, actress Joan Crawford, Christina Crawford is hitting the road to promote a 400-page revision. "I put in eyewitness accounts

that had come to me after the book was published. It's now a complete chronicle of a very turbulent and chaotic, and compelling, and in some instances, loving relationship that covers almost 40 years," she said. Crawford, 58, begins a series of speaking engagements Wednesday at the Royal Theater in Los Angeles. "April Fool's with Christina Crawford" will also tour Seattle, New York and Chicago.

The evening will include a showing of the 1981 movie *Mommie Dearest*, starring Faye Dunaway, though Christina Crawford has criticized the film as "a piece of fiction." The new book, which Crawford published by herself, is available through the Internet. Joan Crawford, who starred in such movies as *Mildred Pierce*, *Whatever Happened to Baby Jane?* and *Autumn Leaves*, died in 1970.

**Macaulay Culkin to marry Rachel Miner**

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Macaulay Culkin won't be home alone anymore. The *Home Alone* star is marrying actress Rachel Miner. Both are 17. "We're so happy and proud that we found each other at such a young age. We look forward to spending our lives together," the couple said in a statement Monday.

No wedding date has been set, they said. Miner co-stars in "The Diary of Anne Frank" on Broadway.

**Winan sisters to lobby for values**

NASHVILLE, Tenn. (AP) — Gospel singers Angie & Debbie Winans are going to Washington this week to fight the enemy spirit they say is inside homosexuals.

The sisters plan to lobby on behalf of the Traditional Coalition against a bill that would give homosexuals the right to marry. "We got a zeal. We're the enemy," Angie Winan said last week.

"There's a spirit that's sexual spirit. It's unclear. God. That spirit is the enemy, it's deceitful." David Smith, spokesman for the Human Rights Campaign in Washington, said: "It's sad that individuals are devoting time and energy into promoting discrimination against gay people."

The Winans sisters stirred last fall with a song "Not Natural" that took an anti-gay verse.

**Imperial War Museum displays Di's armor**

LONDON — The book worn by Diana was visited by minefields display at the Imperial War Museum.

**TriStar and Columbia combine under Sony**

CUIVER CITY, Calif. (AP) — Pictures Entertainment said today that it combined Columbia Pictures and TriStar Pictures into a new studio, a move aimed at streamlining production under a single brand name.

TriStar, producer of the *Jerry Maguire* and *As Good as Dead* will become a part of Columbia's restructuring, which includes the business, legal and story departments of the two studios.

"This restructuring is a smarter, more creative way to do business," said John Callahan, president and chief operating officer of Sony Pictures.

The goal, he said, was to reduce production to 20 to 24 films a year. By combining the production departments, he said, "we will be able to concentrate the efforts of the talented people we have working on both sides of the lot and accomplish the ambitious program of films we have planned."

Columbia President Amy Poehler will run the combined operation. Christopher Lee, president of production at TriStar, will hold the title at the new studio.

The change will boost Sony's visibility with moviegoers by presenting films under a single brand name, said analyst David Adams. *Hooligan Looked Howard* is in Los Angeles.

The public often fails to appreciate the studios with their products, he said.

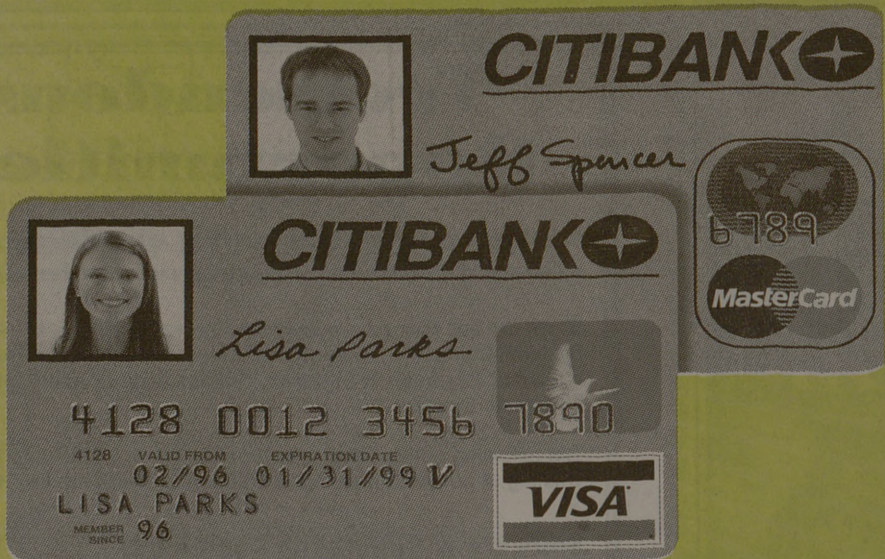
"The management team has been in place on the business side for some time. The business has moved ahead in some innovative ways," he said.

"This appears to be part of an overall strategic plan." TriStar began in 1982 as a joint venture by Columbia, CBS Television and Home Box Office.

TriStar and Columbia were merged by Sony in 1989. TriStar productions include *Rambo: First Blood Part 2*, *Top Gun*, *Terminator 2: Judgment Day* and *Basic Instinct*.

Columbia, which celebrated its 75th anniversary next year, was established in 1924 and produced such films as *Gandhi*, *The Last Emperor*, *Lawrence of Arabia* and *Man for All Seasons*.
