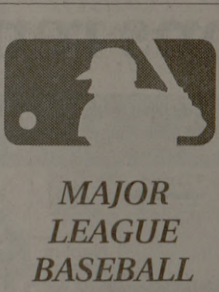


Braves win 2nd title of '90s

The team will travel to Orlando, Fla. on Friday to compete in the United States Collegiate Golf Championship at Lake Buena Vista Golf Club.

Junior golfer Ryan Palmer has been as hot as anyone across the country during the month of March.

The Amarillo, Texas, native has won the last two tournaments he has entered. Palmer shot a one-over-par 217 at the Louisiana Classic at Oakbourne Country Club in Lafayette, La., on the weekend of March 9-10.

Palmer blew away the rest of the competition on Sunday when he fired a final-round 65 to capture his second tournament victory of the year.

Currently Palmer ranks second on the team in scoring average, averaging 73.13 per round.
