Lowrance joins Texas A&M shot put hopes



Texas A&M's injury-depleted track and field team managed to finish the Texas Relays this past weekend without suffering any additional injuries. The men's team should get a huge boost this weekend at the A&M Invitational with the return of juniors Toya Jones, Micheal Price and Mike Lowrance and seniors Larry Wade and Billy Fobbs to competitive action. The women, however, continue to improve and appear to be just a few events away from the top teams in the nation.

Olympic Pipe-Line

Texas A&M has not only become synonymous with Linebacker University but also with

producing Olympic athletes in the shot put. Darrow Hooper won the silver medal in the 1952 games. Randy Matson won the silver in 1964 and the gold in 1968. Randy Barnes won the silver in 1988 and the gold in the most recent 1996 games and Mike Stulce won the gold in 1992.

Lowrance appears to be next in the impressive line of A&M shot putters. He is among the top 10 performers in school history and should return to action this weekend after sitting out the Texas Relays.

The Coveted Fourth Leg

Last season, Texas A&M's 4x100-meter relay team captured the National Championship in a time of 38.80 seconds. The members of that team included Fobbs, Jones, Price and Danny McCray. Of those, McCray is the only one that has graduated and moved on.

Now, Coach Ted Nelson is left with the difficult decision of replacing McCray and attempting to get the team back to national prominence. Among the candidates to replace McCray include freshmen Joel Nelson and Kris Allen, as well as senior hurdler Wade.

The 4x100-meter relay team should be chosen in the next couple of weeks and will begin

their defense of the national title.

Future's So Bright

This past weekend at the Texas Relays there was also a division designated specifically for high school athletes. Among athletes, several of the top finishers committed to attending Texas A&M in the fall competing for the Aggies.

Kendra Reimer from New Braunfels is currently the top heptathlete in the state, finished third in the 100-meter hurdles, Gulli of Klein and Brandon Beasley of King are two of the top distance runners in the state and both placed third in the boys' 3,200-meter runs.

Kristy Bonn of Lockhart is also a runner and also finished third in the 100-meter run. Taylor Whitley is a top performer from Sudan and won the high school shot put. He could join Lowrance next year and two could prove to be an exceptional duo.

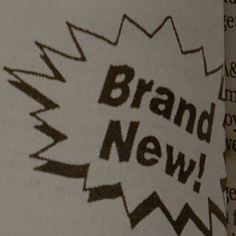
