and sports team ownership. The Houston meeting, scheduled
for 90 minutes and broad cast live on for 90 minutes and broadcast live on
ESPN, was the second of ESPN, was the second of Clinton's
three planned nationally televised three planned nationally televised
town hall meetings on race. The first was in Akron in December.
Why sports? "Race in sports offers an analogy
that really can be translated into the that really can be translated into the
larger society," JudithWinston, exec utive director of Clinton's race initia-
tive, said before the session at the downtownWortham Theater Center "We think this is a great opportunity to illustrate some substantial the way we dealt with race relations - both our successes and our continuing challenges," she added.

In Houston, the forum's makeup angered Latino activists who complained that too few Hispanics were
represented. Felipe Lopez, a basket represented. Felipe Lopez, a basket-
ball star at St. John's University, was ball star at St. John's University, was
the only Hispanic on the 11-member the only Hispanic on the 11 -member
panel. ESPN added Lopez after a Latino group wrote to Clinton to protest. Lockhart said ESPN had invited
numerous Hispanic sports figures, numerous Hispanic sports figures,
who declined for various reasons. He who declined for various reasons. He
said the White House was satisfied with the final group. "It is a good panel bringing a wide variety of opinions and experiences," Lockhart said. In a move that Lockhart said was panel's makeup, Clinton met privately with a group of local Hispanic
leaders at his hotel before the forum.
