Garza said the top 10 percent bill passed this year will allow high school students who graduated in the top 10 percent of their graduating class auto-

"The top 10 percent bill should improve the pool of applicants and numbers admitted to Texas A&M and the University of Texas," Garza said. "More will take advantage of their high school class status."

The Texas Exes Student Association raised private finds for incoming freshman, of which minorities are given special consideration. The scholarship funds will be available for incoming freshman at the University of Texas in

Garza said that state universities must encourage incoming freshman to come to the campus through programs, particularly those geared to the financially disabled.

We must make a point to keep students informed of financial incentives,' Garza said. "The better informed that individuals are, the better. We need to look towards the future.

The University of Houston has increased minority enrollment since Hopwood.




