One of those most often asked questions is, "Why do you want to study bugs?" Casper said entomology has more applications than people might normally consider.

"When you tell someone you're an entomology major, their first response is often 'that's off the wall,' or 'there's no opportunities or job market,'" Casper said. "Actually the major is quite versatile. It's one of the few science degrees that you can take out and apply at the bachelor's degree level."

Obst said the department is still growing into new areas of application, although he notably left out any hint at an entomologist gourmet cooking class.

"I'm in it more for the agricultural side, but many students go into medical or urban entomology," Obst said. "The department is starting a new forensic entomology class."

Casper added her enthusiasm for the forensic class, which would teach entomologists how to help authorities investigate crimes based on evidence from insect activity.

"They've featured it on 'X-Files' before; that's how a lot of people know about it. That exposure has really helped the field," Casper said. "You have to have the stomach for it, though."

Not everyone has the stomach for bugs, but that's what makes the undergraduate entomology club unique. Just be careful when they're giving out free cookies.

Even so, Tatum said Freebird's attracts a wide group of loyal patrons. She sees some professors at least four times a week. "We do get a lot of repeat customers," she said proudly.

Dubé believes it is the food that keeps customers coming back. "We use the highest quality ingredients," she said. "We make everything here, so there's nothing canned and everything's fresh."

Tatum said the kitchen managers test the food twice each shift. If it doesn't taste right, it goes out, she said firmly.

"The food is so good," enthused Carolyn Goodwin, a freshman business major. "It's like rolling every food group into a log. It's awesome."

The burritos come in three sizes: regular, monster and super monster. Customers also choose from four tortilla flavors: flour, wheat, spinach and cayenne. "You get full, and you get your money's worth," Tatum said.

Mary Dubé said she also believes how customers get their food is key. "You get your food quickly, it's not expensive and it's a fun environment," she said. The store's unique atmosphere, like the graffiti wall, comes from the personalities of its founders, she explained.

"The graffiti wall's been a great part of the decor," she related. "It makes people feel more a part of the restaurant, kind of like it's theirs and they're leaving their mark."

"I think really in this community with A&M, a lot of people really feel a part of

Freebird's," she said. "They feel a sense of ownership."

At the new location, there's no sign of the old location's name, but customers have left their mark with a wide variety of aluminum creations.

A half-bricked side wall is home to everything from animals to sports. The letters lovingly crafted from bricks and wrapped in aluminum.

The bricks on which they rest are actually recycled from A&M's last location, Puryear Halls, which were torn down in 1995.

Dubé said using the bricks came as a part of A&M within the store, and fit in with the store construction's environmental focus. Freebird's has a "green consultant" to advise on most environmentally conscious building methods and materials.

The company used non-toxic paint and leftover building materials donated to Habitat for Humanity, Dubé said.

Dubé said a corporate expansion is definitely in the works. She estimated that the owners are proceeding slowly with the growth to prevent loss of any of the company's trademark appeals.

For now, customers like Rita are happy with Freebird's as it is.

"The food's good, the service is great and the people are friendly," she said. "I then turned her full attention back to more pressing issue: her lunch."
