On-campus residents will be on the move

School is almost out for the summer and that means its closing time again for many of the 10,000 students living on campus.

Closing time means packing and moving home for the summer.

Residence halls are scheduled to close officially on May 17 at noon for the spring session. All students living in residence halls on campus must check out with a resident advisor and be completely moved out of the residence hall 24 hours after the last final.

Dan Mizer, the assistant director of the Department of Residence Life, suggests that students check out as soon as possible.

"If students can check out with a resident advisor as soon as possible, that will help reduce traffic flow," Mizer said. "We are checking out a small city of occupants in a small amount of time."

Student residents living in Southside residence halls may load vehicles on Lubbock Street and Mosher Lane, which will be open to one-way traffic and one-side parking from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. May 11 to 15.

Parking, Traffic and Transportation Services (PTTS) Director Tom Williams said people using Lubbock Street for loading purposes may enter from Coke Street and exit into Bizzell Street.

Bizzell Street will have parking available on both sides of the street and will be open to regular two-way traffic.

Any students wanting to stay on campus after 5 p.m. on May 14 must complete a Request for Extended Residence Hall

Occupancy form available from the Department of Residence Life. Current students living on campus with reservations for the first summer school session will be eligible for interim housing, which lasts from May 15 to 27.

The students may sign up for interim housing on May 11 and 12 between 10 a.m. and 5 p.m. at the Housing Assignment

Office, which is located in 101 Y building.

The cost for interim housing is \$50 and will be billed to a student's fee statement. Parking Area 48, which is located to Kyle Field, will be open to students between semesters.

Mizer said he encourages students to discard unwanted items in the trash receptacles in the residence halls.

"What would aid in a smoother check out is if people could take their unwanted items and put them in the container," Mizer said. "That would aid customer service."

The Salvation Army will be taking unwanted items such as clothing and furniture in the North and South areas May 13 and 14 from 3 p.m. to 7 p.m. Drop-off locations include A-1 Lounge, Morris Hall, Apelt Hall and Rudder Hall.

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
