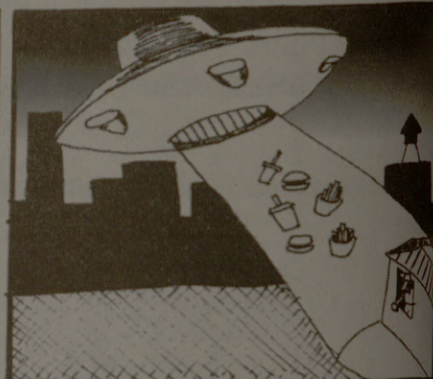
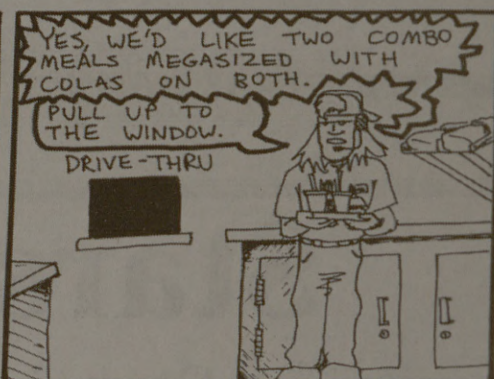
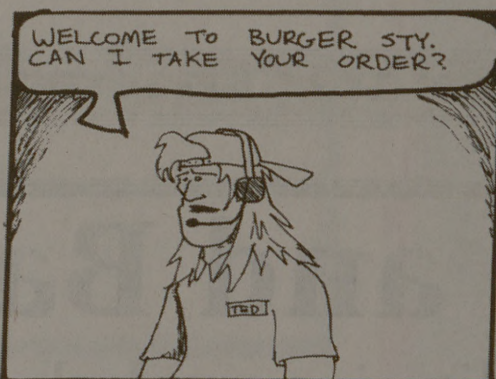
Jim Ashlock, executive director of university relations, said although more confirmed admissions for African-American and Hispanic students are up, A&M cannot assume the number of minority students attending A&M will remain high once fall classes begin.

Ashlock said the final number of minority students will depend on

the number of summer conference attendees who enroll, how many summer provisional students will succeed and how many scholarship athletes will be admitted.

"These and other numerous changes from last year make it impractical to predict at this time what our minority student picture will be in September," said Ashlock.
