**Kent inducted into Tennis Hall of Fame**

Legendary Texas A&M Men's Tennis Coach David Kent was inducted into the Intercollegiate Tennis Association College Tennis Hall of Fame on Wednesday night at a ceremony held in Athens, Ga., before a crowd of Kent's friends and family.

Kent, a 27-year veteran of tennis coaching, thanked those who attended and joked with those he had met during his career.

"I have been in coaching a long time," Kent said. "It is just amazing. In 1959 it all started. I blinked my eyes and here I am today.

"This is the one award I always wanted. I have coached at two great universities at West Texas and Texas A&M. I don't miss coaching, but I miss being around the great coaches and players. It's great to be back

around so many of them this week and to be here in Athens."

Kent also thanked Dave Snyder of Texas for contributing to his retirement because of health problems in 1996.

"I have to thank Dave Snyder who forced me to retire from coaching," Kent said.

"His team beat us on a Saturday and I had a heart attack on Monday. And that was the last match I coached."

Dan Magill, long-time Georgia tennis coach and hall chairman in-

ducted Kent with some complementary words.

"David Kent has one of the very best records in tennis in Texas," Magill said. "He is one of the most beloved coaches in the nation, and he has followed in the footsteps of some of the best coaches in Texas like Penick and Allison at the University of Texas."

Kent coached A&M tennis for 18 years from 1979-96 and helped the Aggies to a first-place tie for the Southwest Conference title in 1994. Kent saw nine of his players qualify for NCAA events during his tenure and coached players to various Southwest Conference titles in 12 of his 18 seasons.

His career record at A&M was 316-161, the best winning percentage of any tennis coach in school history.

**Doubles team ousted at NCAA**

The No. 34-ranked Texas doubles team of freshman Madden and senior Carlos to Pepperdine's Kelly and Robert Lindstedt 6-2, 4-6 and the first round of the NCAA Individual Championships Thursday at the Henry Feild Tennis Stadium at the University of Georgia.

The duo ended their season with a 13-7 overall record in doubles competition.

"Once again we got off to a start, but we made a good comeback," Coach Tim Cass said. "Pepperdine is a good team and we did a good job of hanging in there."

With the loss, the Aggies ended a successful season that saw them rise from No. 63 in the nation at the start of the season to No. 11 and a place finish in the Big 12 Conference.

The Aggies also captured the Big 12 Tournament Championship in school history, and advanced to the finals of the NCAA Individual Championships.

"If you would have seen what we would accomplish all that we did, you would have been surprised and pleased," said Cass, the Aggie Coach of the Year. "When you come to the NCAA, you are the best players and teams in the country and it's difficult to just try to build on the momentum we created for next year."

**de Mesa loses NCAA first round**

The Big 12 Freshman of the Year Rafael de Mesa fell in the first round of the NCAA Individual Championships, 6-4, 4-6 and 6-4 Wednesday to Arizona State's Stavros Marcaccio at the Henry Feild Tennis Stadium on the University of Georgia campus.

He finishes his season with a 13 overall singles record.

"At the NCAA, everything is so good," Coach Tim Cass said. "I got off to a slow start, but I was one of only four or five men in the tournament. It was a great honor for him to be here and have had a heck of a year."

**No. 10 golf team falters to 19th**

The No. 10 Texas A&M Men's Golf Team finished 19th out of 24 teams in the NCAA West Regional at the Ford Golf Course on May 9.

Senior Jamie Hullet shot a 22-over-par 223, while senior Perched Kirchner shot a 22-over-par 224 and freshman Marta Ostos shot a 22-over-par 237.

Seniors Isabella Roseberg and Kirchner finished their seasons by accomplishing what the Aggie A&M team had done by reaching a regional tournament four consecutive years and qualifying for the NCAA's in 1997 for the first time since 1985. They led the Aggies to six national titles and finished no lower than second place at the conference championships each year, including capturing the Big 12 Conference title in this year.

The Aggies finished their season with two tournament titles, won the GTE/Mo'Morial in College Station and the Big 12 Conference Championship in Norman, Okla.

**Aggies head to All-American**

Several members of the Texas A&M Baseball Team were selected to Baseball America's 1998 All-American Team over the weekend.

Starting pitcher Ryan Rupe was named to the second team. Rupe finished with an 11-4 record with a 2.33 ERA and 125 strikeouts in 113 innings. Outfielder Jason Tyner was named to the second team. Tyner finished with a .385 batting average and 107 hits in 278 at bats and 39 stolen bases.

Rupe was also selected as first-team starting pitcher for the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association and starting pitcher Casey Foster was selected to the second team.
