Bulls defeat Pacers 88-83, Jordan scores 28 to back up guarantee

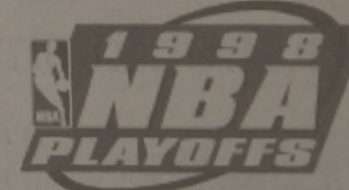
CHICAGO (AP) — This was not the expiration date for the Chicago Bulls. Their dynasty has survived to see another series.

The Bulls made it back to the NBA Finals on Sunday night and kept alive their quest for a sixth championship by outlasting the Indiana Pacers 88-83 in a riveting Game 7 of the Eastern Conference finals.

In a tight, back-and-forth game that culminated two weeks of struggle and drama, the Bulls used their ability to excel in pressure situations to overcome the Pacers' determination and grit.

It all came down to the final five minutes, and Michael Jordan and his teammates displayed intensity and control as they came up with all the clutch plays.

The Bulls scored nine of the game's final 13 points and watched



the Pacers fail to find ways to match them as they moved on to a date with the Utah Jazz beginning Wednesday night.

Chicago will be playing for its sixth championship this decade, and perhaps to somehow keep their dynasty intact — quite an accomplishment for a team that was greeted on its home court Sunday by a mood of desperation and finality.

In this city where fans have become spoiled by the routiness of titles and the greatness of Jordan, there was a strange feeling surrounding this game.

Could this really be the end of the run, the "Last Dance" as coach Phil Jackson keeps calling it?

It might have been, if not for the way Chicago played at the end. The game was tied 79-79 going

into the final five minutes that's when the Bulls showed why they are the most valuable five years of a championship run experience can be.

Scottie Pippen scored 18 points, including a jumper after grabbing one of the game's 22 offensive rebounds, and Dan Drew a double-team shot while the Pacers were committing three turnovers and missing three shots.

A putback by Antonio Davis made it 85-83 with 2:12 left. The Bulls then came right back with a hook shot with 1:59 left — although he missed a chance to convert a three-point play.

Mark Jackson threw away on Indiana's next possession — of 13 miscues by the Pacers. Bulls would miss their next shots, running the clock inside seconds as they retained possession with another offensive rebound.

Still trailing by four, the Bulls took the first open shot sent to the Pacers and missed. A wide-open jumper, Jordan rebounded, the Pacers fouled Harper and his free throw with seconds left completed the series.

Bichette launches game-winning home run against Astros

DENVER (AP) — Dante Bichette hit a two-out, two-run homer in the ninth, lifting the Colorado Rockies over the Houston Astros 7-5 Sunday.

Bichette's blast off Doug Henry (3-2) helped the Rockies maintain their mastery in Denver over the Astros, who are 6-21 here.

Chuck McElroy (1-1) pitched a perfect eighth and ninth to earn the win.

Pinch-hitter Jason Bates led off the ninth with sharp single to center. Pinch-runner Curtis Goodwin stole second, thanks to catcher Brad Ausmus' high throw, and was sacrificed to third by Nefti Perez.

Ellis Burks popped out, but Bichette, who had failed in clutch

hitting situations recently and was 0-for-3 with the bases loaded in the past three games, homered into the bullpen in right-center.

Moises Alou homered twice and drove in four runs for the Astros. Vinny Castilla had a two-run homer and three RBI for Colorado.

The Rockies struck for four runs in the first off Jose Lima. Perez walked, was sacrificed to second and scored on Larry Walker's two-out, broken-bat single to center. Castilla then hit Lima's first pitch into the left-field stands for his 19th homer, and Todd Helton followed with a solo shot to right-center, his seventh.

After squandering a leadoff double in the second, the Rockies converted in the third when Bichette opened with a double, advancing a groundout and scored on Castillo's slow grounder to short for a 5-4 lead.

Houston got a run in the second off Bobby Jones on Craig Biggio's RBI double into the field corner. Alou hit a solo homer his 10th, in the fifth.

Jones nursed a 5-2 lead in the seventh, when the Astros hit on Alou's three-run homer. Dave Veres.

Biggio led off the inning with a walk and went to third on Veres' broken-bat single, but Jones retired Jeff Bagwell on a popout, but Alou launched a foot homer to center.
