

WASHINGTON (AP) — The cost of mailing a letter will go up by a penny early next year, the Postal Service's governing board announced vesterday.

The new rates, approved by the independent Postal Rate Commission on May 11, will take effect Jan. 10, 1999, board chair Sam Winters

The new rates will boost the cost of mailing a first-class letter by one cent, to 33 cents. A variety of changes will affect other classes of

"This penny increase is the right amount at the right time," Winters said at the postal governors' monthly meeting.

"The rate adjustment is being made to provide a continuing investment in America's communications future," he said.

Other rate changes included include a cut in the price of sending additional ounces of firstclass mail from 23 cents to 22 cents.

Thus, a 1-ounce letter will go up to 33 cents, 2-ounces will be the same as now, totaling 55 cents, and heavier letters will cost less than at


