ZAMORA "I would say it's more consistent with two or more perpetrators because of the blood in the

back seat," Max Courtney, owner of Forensic Consultant Services, testified for the prosecution in the capital murder trial of former Air Force Academy

Under cross-examination, Courtney agreed four blood traces in the back seat of the 1992 Mazda Protege could have gotten there from someone tossing bloody clothes into the fourdoor car.

'It's possible," Courtney said. The car belonged to the family of former Naval Academy midshipman Diane Zamora, Graham's ex-fiancee who was convicted of capital murder in Fort Worth in February and is serving a life sentence.

Prosecutors claim Graham and Zamora murdered Jones on Dec. 4, 1995, while in high school in the Fort Worth area because a jealous Zamora wrongly believed Graham had sex with Jones and demanded that he kill her.



Friday evening, one day after the napalm train passed over a concrete railroad trestle southeast of Temple, the bridge collapsed as a Burlington Northern Santa Fe derailed and slammed into it, railroad spokesperson Jerry Jenkins said.

Thirty-six of the train's 117 cars fell onto or along Texas Highway 36.
