Buffaloes look to make '98 comeback after break in 12-season winning streak

DALLAS — In 1997, Colorado coach Rick Neuheisel found out what preseason polls really mean. Neuheisel's Buffaloes found themselves ranked No. 1 in the nation by the Sporting News and were the favorite to contend for a national championship. Those predictions were taken apart like Michigan dismantled the Buffalo defense in a mid-September showdown at Ann Arbor. The 27-3 Wolverine victory sent Colorado spinning into its first losing season since 1984 and ended a run of 12 consecutive winning seasons. "When you have a season like we experienced last year, it takes a while to get that taste out of your mouth," Neuheisel said. "You have to wait a long time until you can play again." The misfortune suffered by the Buffaloes is understandable considering their brutal schedule, one ranked toughest in the nation by the NCAA computer rankings. Non-conference games against Colorado State, Wyoming and eventual national champi-

on Michigan were joined by conference games against Texas A&M, Missouri State and Nebraska. "We can't explain what happened," senior wide receiver Darren Chisler said. "That's college football. But what we as senior class is come back this year. Colorado football back on the map and back into the national rankings and getting time bowl." Neuheisel said as long as the players believe what it takes to get there, the road is never smooth — however rocky it may be navigated by his squad. "When you are a part of a winning team you come to expect winning, and you have to look forward to the fruits of winning than remembering what are the ingredients to go into providing that winning. "I think our team experienced first-hand that I did, that you have to earn it. You cannot take anything for granted."

Continued from Page 3 Osborne compiled a 255-49-3 record and went to 25 consecutive bowls in his tenure as head Cornhusker. Osborne also won nine or more games each season. Replacing a legend like Osborne would be difficult for many teams, but he had his successor picked out before he tipped his hand to the media. "It was very casually done," Solich said. "He knocked at my door and said that he felt he was ready to retire. The entire process took about ten minutes. He told me prior to the start of the season in late July. He also told me he would forward my name when he did retire." Nebraska players did not expect the coaching change, but senior fullback Joel Mackovika said they will not mind going after another title with the new man in charge. "The transition has been so smooth," he said, "that the team has accepted it and is working harder this summer than any I can remember." Following the legend of Osborne is not the only tough task Solich faces this season. Road games against top-25 teams Oklahoma State, Texas A&M and Kansas State make the Cornhusker Big 12 Conference schedule their toughest in years. But that is exactly what national titles are made of. If anyone should know this, Nebraska should.

Continued from Page 3 The 1997 season ended with three years of self-imposed probation and another NCAA decision about the eligibility questions surrounding receiver Malcolm McKenzie is due before the end of the month. Tech players have more to answer than questions about football, but senior receiver Donnie Hart said the team is focused on the job it has to do. "Our whole job here is to go to class, play football and lift weights," he said. "I don't think they

are going to close school or close the room, so we're just going to keep on going." Tech will not be eligible for bowl consideration for at least the next three years, which is more harmful than expected looking at the schedule. Non-conference games against Texas A&M, North Texas and Fresno State along with a conference schedule containing only three wins with a winning record a year ago adds a favorable schedule in 1998. "We really can't worry about that," senior defensive end Montae Regor said. "We just got to get ready and play ball. There are a lot of speculations on what may happen, but our main goal is to get ready for this football season."

Alou makes 25th season homer record for Astros' Hoffman

SAN DIEGO (AP) — In 41 straight save chances, Trevor Hoffman had been perfect. Then on one pitch, his streak ended and so did his bid to set a major league record. The San Diego closer gave up a home run to Moises Alou on his first delivery in the ninth inning Sunday, tying the game. The Padres wound up beating Houston 5-4 in the 10th, but Hoffman blew his chance at history. Hoffman entered
