



Dealing with suffering and death is an important part of a physician's work, Engelhardt said.

"There's no way people can escape from suffering," Engelhardt said. 'You'll become geographers of what it is to suffer the human condition." Engelhardt concluded by saying just how unique the medical profession is.

"Medicine is one of the three learned professions along with law and theology," Engelhardt said. "No other enterprise sees humans so naked, literally, in all their living, suffering and dying."

HOUSTON (AP) - Recovery crews on Monday began removing containers filled with hazardous materials from a 230-foot freighter that sank while being loaded in the Houston Ship Channel.

No chemicals have escaped and no one was injured when the Floreana went down Saturday night after docking to take on oilfield chemicals

"Nothing has leaked and none of the debris from the sinking has ventured out past the area around the terminal," Coast Guard Lt. j.g. Dennis Miller said. 


