Knockoff kicks high but falls

A well-informed public is essential to maintaining a democracy. How is this for information? The studio executives in charge of *Knockoff*, Jean-Claude Van Damme's return to doing the splits on the silver screen, never even bothered to show critics the movie before opening night.

This lack of confidence is justified. Hark, normally a genius in the action genre, directs a lame duck, attempting to blend physical action with buddy-buddy comedy.

This combination worked better in the *Lethal Weapon* series.

When Van Damme tries to emulate the new Hong Kong talents, it comes across as borrowed.

The first single off the album, "Whose bed have your boots been under?" rose to No. 11 on the Billboard Country Singles chart.

The second single, "Any man of mine," made the Billboard chart in May and spent 20 weeks on it.

That and four other tracks from the album topped the Country Singles chart at No. 1 including " (If you're not in it for love) I'm outta here," "The woman in me (needs the man in you)," "You win my love" and "No one needs to know."

Despite its success, no touring was ever done for the album.

Two and a half years later, *Come on Over*, the follow-up to *The Woman in Me*, was released. The album has sold 12 million copies since last November.

Its first single, "You're Still the One," topped Billboard's Country and Pop Singles chart at No. 1.

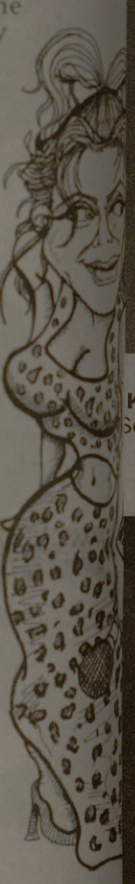
Twain has won numerous awards including a Grammy for Best Country Album from the Academy of Country Music and Canadian Country Music awards and the Canadian JUNO award.
