# Sosa slams 61,62 for tie

Roger. Slammin' Sammy hit two more homers to tie Mark McGwire — and now they're in the greatest home run derby of all time.

Sammy Sosa hit Nos. 61 and 62 against the Milwaukee Brewers on Sunday to match the record McGwire had set five days earlier. With two powerful swings on a spectacu-

lar and wild afternoon at Wrigley Field, Sosa passed Babe Ruth and Roger Maris. Sosa and McGwire now have two weeks

left in their race for the most treasured record in baseball in one of the sport's most unforgettable seasons. "It's unbelievable. It was something that

even I can't believe I was doing," Sosa said

following the Cubs' 11-10, 10-inning victory. "It can happen to two people, Mark and I." Sosa, who trailed McGwire 24-9 in late May, homered off Bronswell Patrick in the fifth inning, sending an 0-1 pitch 480 feet into

the street behind the left-field fence at

He hit another 480-foot homer in the ninth,

a solo shot off Eric Plunk. That one dropped Ruth into fourth place on the single-season list with 60, which he hit

Maris hit 61 homers in 1961 for a record that McGwire broke Tuesday against the Cubs in St. Louis.

Now, amazingly, a mark that had stood for 37 years has been passed twice in less than a week

With tears and sweat running down his face as he sat in the dugout after his second triumphant tour around the bases, Sosa came out for three emotional curtain calls.

Fans littered the field with paper cups and other debris while chanting "Sam-mee! Sammee!" causing a delay that lasted six minutes. "I don't usually cry, but I cry inside. I was

blowing kisses to my mother, I was crying a little bit," Sosa said.
